# Asked on 1 May 2025

MS W BOURNE ASKED MINISTER FOR YOUTH JUSTICE AND VICTIM SUPPORT AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON L GERBER)

#### QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise (in table format, reported separately by order/penalty and most recent annual cohort), for each of the following orders/penalties the number of young people subject to (a) restorative justice presentence referrals, (b) restorative justice orders, (c) community service orders, (d) supervised release orders, (e) probation orders, (f) graffiti removal orders, (g) conditional release orders, (f) intensive supervision orders, (g) detention orders, (h) reprimands, (i) good behaviour orders, (j) fines, (k) drug assessment and education orders, (i) restitution and compensation orders and (m) licence disqualification orders?

### ANSWER:

The Crisafulli Government is committed to using every avenue to stop the youth crime crisis to ensure Queenslanders are safe and at-risk youths are provided the best opportunities to reform their behaviour.

The figures contained in Table 1 contain the number of distinct young people who had an order made for one of the listed order types between 1 October 2023 and 26 September 2024.

The same young person may have received more than one type of order during the period and therefore a young person may be counted in more than one order type. This means the sum of young people receiving each order type will be greater than the total number of distinct young people who had an order made in the period.
