MR N DAMETTO ASKED MINISTER FOR YOUTH JUSTICE AND VICTIM SUPPORT AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON L GERBER)

QUESTION:

With reference to the Regional Reset and Staying on Track programs—

Will the Minister provide the names of the successful applicants for each of these programs for each region where the programs will be delivered and expected commencement dates?

ANSWER:

The Crisafulli Government is committed to restoring safety in Queensland homes, workplaces and communities.

The Making Queensland Safer Plan is well underway. On 13 December 2024, the first tranche of the Making Queensland Safer Laws became law. On 21 May 2025, we passed the second tranche of Adult Crime, Adult Time.

In February 2025, Staying on Track and Regional Reset went to market for tenders.

The Regional Reset programs will be delivered in nine locations across the state: Far North Queensland; North Queensland; Central Queensland (Rockhampton); Gold Coast-Logan; Ipswich-Darling Downs (Ipswich); Brisbane; Sunshine Coast; Wide Bay (Bundaberg); and Western Queensland.

Tenders have now closed for both programs. The Department of Youth Justice and Victim Support is reviewing applications and operations will begin in due course, following the announcement of successful applicants.
