MS C MCMILLAN asked the Minister for Families, Seniors and Disability Services and Minister for Child Safety and the Prevention of Domestic and Family Violence (HON A CAMM)—

QUESTION

With reference to the roll out of GPS tracking devices for high-risk perpetrators of domestic and family violence—

Will the Minister advise (a) how many of the initial 150 devices have been issued and (b) when the remaining 350 GPS trackers are expected to be issued by?

ANSWER

Commencing in the 2025-26 financial year, my Department of Families, Seniors, Disability Services and Child Safety is leading work to deliver an electronic monitoring pilot of high-risk domestic and family violence offenders.

We are funding the introduction of 150 GPS trackers later this year and I am pleased to be leading, on behalf of our state government, the new way in which we will deliver GPS monitoring devices in a whole-of-government approach.

The remaining 350 devices will be available once an initial evaluation of the first 150 is undertaken.
