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**MR J MARTIN** ASKED THE MINISTER FOR NATURAL RESOURCES AND MINES, MINISTER FOR MANUFACTURING AND MINISTER FOR REGIONAL AND RURAL DEVELOPMENT (HON D LAST)—

QUESTION:

With reference to government-owned land within the Stretton Electorate—

Will the Minister advise the total parcels of land held that are currently un-used/vacant (reported separately by size, value and location)?

ANSWER:

Details of state government land that is unused/vacant are held by individual agencies.

The Department of Natural Resources and Mines, Manufacturing and Regional and Rural Development maintains the Government Land Register (GLR)—the principal source of information for all Queensland Government-owned property.

It is however, the responsibility of individual agencies to ensure complete, current and accurate information is included in the GLR.

According to information contained in the GLR, there are two properties held by government departments that have been declared surplus to their requirements within the Stretton Electorate:

- 9844m<sup>2</sup> property located in Acacia Ridge
- 1.9 hectare property located in Calamvale.

While an agency may identify that they no longer require a property on the GLR, the property may be required for use by another agency and interagency transfers are given priority over open market sales.

Where there is no interest from another agency, the land will be sold on the open market in line with the Queensland Government Land Transaction Policy (introduced in 1995 and endorsed by successive governments to provide government agencies with a consistent set of guidelines for land and property transactions).
