HON M DE BRENNI ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES (HON D PURDIE)—

QUESTION:

With reference to the Minister's joint media release with the Treasurer, which states 'Every police district across the state will receive a further \$4.6m in the 2025-26 financial year alone for Tyre Deflation Devices,' noting funding 15 police districts would equate to \$69m in 2025-26—

Will the Minister outline where the funding is allocated in the budget papers?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS), that the QPS has been funded to expand their current Tyre Deflation Devices (TDDs) to ensure that every officer in every District has access to a TDD.

The Crisafulli Government stands by that commitment and we are delivering on that.

I am advised that the QPS has a total of 2,506 operational vehicles currently within the fleet and in use across the State of Queensland.

I am further informed that the QPS has a total of 883 serviceable and functioning TDDs which are currently provided within frontline operational vehicles. The provided funding of \$6.6m over 4 years and \$184,000 ongoing from 2029-30 has been allocated to enable every front-line operational police vehicle to be fitted with a TDD, to ensure every officer has access to a serviceable and functioning TDD.

I am advised that this funding enables the purchase of an additional 1,623 operational TDDs for use in Police Service vehicles, and supports the delivery of ongoing maintenance, training and required replacement of this capability.
