HON D FARMER ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES (HON D PURDIE)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister provide a list of recommendations that are yet to be completed from the 'A Call for Change' Report and companion report from the Commission of Inquiry into the Queensland Police Service Response to domestic and family violence?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) that the QPS is the coordinating agency for the Commission of Inquiry into the Queensland Police Service Response to domestic and family violence (COI DFV) and leads the delivery of 60 of the 78 recommendations.

As at 5 July 2025, work has been completed on 65 of the 78 COI DFV recommendations.

Of the remaining 13 recommendations, the below six recommendations are led by the Department of Justice and relate to the proposed establishment of a Police Integrity Unit:

#	Recommendation	Title
1	COIDFV-68	Establish independent Police Integrity Unit with whistle-blower protections
2	COIDFV-69	Publish implementation plan for Police Integrity Unit within 3 months
3	COIDFV-70	Engage external experts in developing Police Integrity Unit.
4	COIDFV-71	CCC reports milestones for Police Integrity Unit every 3 months.
5	COIDFV-72	PCCC reviews Police Integrity Unit after 3 years of operation.
6	COIDFV-73	PCCC conducts independent evaluation of Police Integrity Unit every 5 years.

The work remaining on the below seven recommendations has been incorporated into broader bodies of work or BAU within the QPS:

#	Recommendation	Title
1	COIDFV-11	Review recruitment strategy for diversity & interest in domestic violence.
2	COIDFV-12	Engage Human Rights Commission to increase diversity & inclusion.
3	COIDFV-21	Expand video evidence trial statewide.
4	COIDFV-23	Establish district-level Victim Liaison Officer scheme.
5	COIDFV-26	Establish validated Ethical Health Scorecard.
6	COIDFV-38	Develop scheme for less stressful environments for frontline officers.
7	COIDFV-74	Partner with tertiary institutions for investigative skills training.
