QUESTION:

With reference to Page 86 of Budget Paper 3—

Will the Minister provide a list of PCYC facilities receiving funding and/or scheduled for works under the line item 'PCYC Queensland Capital Works'?

ANSWER:

The Department of Sport, Racing and Olympic and Paralympic Games (DSROPG) is the lead agency in administering a \$74.1 million funding program with Queensland Police-Citizens Youth Welfare Association (PCYC) on behalf of the Queensland Police Service to

support the construction of six new facilities and upgrade of 22 existing facilities statewide.

The 2025–26 Budget includes \$24.2 million in planned funding expenditure for the PCYC Capital Works program as part of a multi-year investment strategy and includes associated works and payments for the following sites - Pimpama PCYC (new), Pine Rivers PCYC (upgrades) and Caloundra PCYC (new).

As part of the 2025-2026 Budget, the Queensland Government confirmed the additional commitments to this program are under 'Resourcing Our Police' for the following two projects, with DSROPG nominated as lead agency:

- An additional \$5 million to support a new PCYC facility at Pimpama.
- \$2.1 million to improve and upgrade facilities at the Pine Rivers PCYC.

Projects already in construction and expected to be completed in the 2025-26 period include ten upgrade projects in Bundaberg, Burdekin, Cairns, Carindale, Crestmead, Mount Gravatt, Mount Isa, Redcliffe, Toowoomba and Upper Ross.

Projects expected to commence construction in the 2025-26 period include 3 new projects in Mareeba, Sandgate and Rockhampton and 7 upgrade projects in Hills District, Mornington Island, Nambour, Palm Island, Redlands, Roma, and Zillmere.
