MR T SMITH ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES (HON D PURDIE)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise on (a) progress of the review of training products against the Domestic and Family Violence Training and Change Management Framework, provided to Queensland Police Service and (b) what training gaps were identified?

ANSWER:

I am advised that in January 2025, People Capability Command completed an extensive mapping and analysis of thirteen domestic and family violence courses against the Queensland Government Domestic and Family Violence Training and Change Management Framework.

I am further advised other courses were considered as part of the holistic evaluation but were not mapped, including components of the Recruit Training, Cultural Capability and Empathy in Action training programs. The QPS has advised the overarching training gaps identified were in three areas namely leadership training, leaders of systems (executive directors, head of human resources and board and management committee members) and volunteers. These gaps were grouped into eight themes and addressed through a revision of the training content.

I am informed the mapped QPS DFV courses have considerable alignment to the Framework, resulting in an assessment that the QPS is DFV Competent on the Framework's continuum of practice stage of maturity.
