MRS M MCMAHON ASKED MINISTER FOR YOUTH JUSTICE AND VICTIM SUPPORT AND MINISTER FOR CORRECTIVE SERVICES (HON L GERBER)

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise (reported separately for each year and by order type) the completion status of supervised youth justice orders commenced, as at 30 June from 2019-20 to 2024?

ANSWER:

Order types include Community Service, Conditional Release, Detention, Graffiti removal, Intensive supervision, Probation, and Restorative Justice.

In 2019-2020, all supervised youth justice orders commenced were completed, except for 17 supervised youth justice orders where the order was set aside on appeal, or review, the order was discharged in the interests of justice or by consent, the youth moved interstate, or the youth was transferred to an adult correctional centre.

In 2020-2021, all supervised youth justice orders commenced were completed, except for 13 supervised youth justice orders where the order was set aside on appeal, or review, the order was discharged in the interests of justice or by consent, the youth moved interstate, or the youth was transferred to an adult correctional centre.

In 2021-2022, all supervised youth justice orders commenced were completed, except for 9 supervised youth justice orders where the order was set aside on appeal, or review, the order was discharged in the interests of justice or by consent, the youth moved interstate, or the youth was transferred to an adult correctional centre.

In 2022-2023, all supervised youth justice orders commenced were completed, except for 12 supervised youth justice orders where the order was set aside on appeal, or review, the order was discharged in the interests of justice or by consent, the youth moved interstate, or the youth was transferred to an adult correctional centre.

In 2023-2024, all supervised youth justice orders commenced were completed, except for 9 supervised youth justice orders where the order was set aside on appeal, or review, the order was discharged in the interests of justice or by consent, the youth moved interstate, or the youth was transferred to an adult correctional centre.

Information regarding order completion, breaches, and other statuses will be included in the forthcoming Children's Court annual report, which is due for release shortly.
