HON L ENOCH asked the Minister for Families, Seniors and Disability Services and Minister for Child Safety and the Prevention of Domestic and Family Violence (HON A CAMM)—

QUESTION

With reference to the Minister's charter letter, where it states that the Minister is responsible for implementing the outstanding recommendations for the Royal Commission into Violence, Abuse, Neglect and Exploitation of People with Disability—

Will the Minister (a) list the Minister's measurable KPIs in relation to this matter and (b) provide the specific timelines that are being followed to ensure outcomes are achieved in relation to the outstanding recommendations?

ANSWER

On 6 June 2025, I reaffirmed Queensland's commitment to the implementation of the joint government response to the Disability Royal Commission through my role on the Disability Reform Ministerial Council, in line with my ministerial charter letter.

Responsibility for implementation of Disability Royal Commission recommendations is shared across Commonwealth, state and territory governments. A total of 130 recommendations were directed to Queensland. Of those, 46 were directed to states and territories, including Queensland, and 84 were directed jointly.

Work to implement Disability Royal Commission recommendations is well underway across a range of Queensland Government portfolios.

The Queensland Government is collaborating with people with disability, their families and sector stakeholders to ensure disability reforms continue to progress. This is occurring with the support of Queenslanders with Disability Network who are leading the implementation of the Queensland Disability Stakeholder Engagement and Co-Design Strategy.
