

## **Question on Notice**

**MR J MARTIN** ASKED THE MINISTER FOR SPORT AND RACING AND MINISTER FOR THE OLYMPIC AND PARALYMPIC GAMES (HON T MANDER) —

### **QUESTION:**

With reference to the meeting which the Minister's office had with Table Tennis Queensland late last year, the response provided to my office in December 2025 and my earlier request for a facility to support both Badminton and Table Tennis—

Will the Minister indicate government support for a multipurpose Badminton-Table Tennis facility to assist these two core Olympic sports as we move towards Brisbane 2032?

### **ANSWER:**

The 2032 Delivery Plan (Plan) sets out a clear vision for delivering infrastructure for the 2032 Olympic and Paralympic Games (Games) and seeks to maximise the opportunity of the Games for the whole state.

While the Plan does not list every single sport or event that can be held in the new and upgraded venues committed to in the Plan, these venues are being constructed so that they can support multiple sports, including Badminton and Table Tennis.

These new and upgraded venues are complementary to the existing venues identified in the Plan, which can support training and competition for these sports, including: Brisbane Entertainment Centre; Cairns Convention Centre; Coomera Indoor Sports Centre; Gold Coast Convention and Exhibition Centre; Gold Coast Sports and Leisure Centre; State Netball Centre; and Sleeman Sports Complex.

Beyond the Plan, there are many other venues across Queensland that are able to host Badminton and Table Tennis training, matches and events, including: Caloundra Indoor Stadium; Gold Coast Recreation Precinct; Morayfield Sports and Events Centre; South Pine Indoor Sports Centre; Sunshine Coast Recreation Precinct; The University of Queensland; Townsville Sports Precinct; and Townsville Stadium.
