HON M DE BRENNI ASKED MINISTER FOR THE ENVIRONMENT AND TOURISM AND MINISTER FOR SCIENCE AND INNOVATION (HON A POWELL)—

QUESTION:

Will the Minister advise whether the government took any action to ensure that the disposal of the property at 610 West Mount Cotton Road, Mount Cotton, by Landscapes Queensland Limited as trustee for the Queensland Trust for Nature's Revolving Fund, was appropriately conditioned to require an access easement, right of transit, or other legally binding right of use arrangement, to protect the important linkage adjoining Venman National Park and its significance to the Koala Coast Eco-Tourism trail, prior to the land being sold?

ANSWER:

In 2024 the former government agreed to transfer the property to the Queensland Trust for Nature. It is important to note that the agreement did not subject the property to any conditions in relation to an access easement, right of transit or other legally binding right of use arrangement. As a result, the property was not subject to those conditions at sale.
