MS J HOWARD asked the Deputy Premier, Minister for State Development, Infrastructure and Planning and Minister for Industrial Relations (HON J BLEIJIE) –

QUESTION:

With reference to the former Labor Government's ShapingSEQ 2023 established housing supply targets for 2031 and 2046, as well as housing diversity sub-targets for each local government area, to guide the preferred mix of housing and support greater housing choice for a growing and changing population—

Will the Deputy Premier advise (a) if each regional plan currently under review will include housing supply targets and housing diversity targets and (b) how the Crisafulli Government will publicly report on progress against housing supply and housing diversity targets in each regional plan?

ANSWER:

The Crisafulli Government is developing new regional plans which cover every corner of the State, in conjunction with infrastructure plans that protect the lifestyle of our communities and appropriately cater for growth. This follows a decade of decline under the former Labor Government where regional plans were left to languish – with some being over 20 years old.

Housing supply is of extreme importance to the Crisafulli Government and housing policy will be determined in partnership with key stakeholders, including local government throughout each regional plan review. These regional plans will be publicly available and any housing targets will be contained within these plans where appropriate.

The Crisafulli Government has also accepted in-principle support for a recommendation from the Queensland Productivity Commission Report for an expanded Growth Monitoring Report (GMR) focussing on land supply, housing delivery, infrastructure coordination and planning outcomes. This GMR will be accompanied by an interactive dashboard which is being developed in collaboration with local governments and state agencies. I note the former Labor Government stopped releasing the annual Land Supply and Development Monitoring Report after 2021.
