HON M BAILEY ASKED MINISTER FOR HEALTH AND AMBULANCE SERVICES
(**HON T NICHOLLS**)—

QUESTION

With reference to the now-vacant land at 51 Park Road Yeronga, the site of the former Yeronga Child and Youth Mental Health Service—

Will the Minister advise (a) the Crisafulli LNP Government's plan for future use of the land and (b) confirm it will remain publicly-owned government land?

ANSWER

The Crisafulli Government saved the Yeronga Child and Youth Mental Health Service project after the new hub promised by the former Labor government failed to be delivered at the Park Road site. The cost blew out more than four times its original budget despite the project being downgraded to a quarter of the size.

Under the Crisafulli Government, services are now being delivered across two sites, bringing care closer to home. This includes the bespoke fit out of a facility in Mt Gravatt which delivers the Children's Health Queensland Child and Youth Service and Eating Disorder Service, complemented by further consult spaces in Taringa, secured in response to feedback that this location would better service consumers from the northern catchment.

I am advised by Children's Health Queensland that there are no current plans to divest their ownership of the Yeronga site and that the site will be considered in future health services planning.
