HON S FENTIMAN ASKED TREASURER, MINISTER FOR ENERGY AND MINISTER FOR HOME OWNERSHIP (HON D JANETZKI)—

QUESTION:

With reference to ongoing concerns regarding fuel supply disruptions and price volatility across Queensland, and the absence of a centralised, publicly accessible source of real-time information—

Will the Treasurer advise (a) whether the Crisafulli Government will develop and implement a publicly accessible, real-time dashboard to provide information on fuel prices and fuel outages across Queensland (b) if yes, the expected month and year for delivery and (c) if no, what alternative measures, if any, are being considered to ensure Queenslanders have access to timely and accurate information on fuel availability and pricing?

ANSWER:

The Queensland Government recognises community concerns regarding fuel supply and pricing pressures arising from ongoing conflict in the Middle East.

Fuel supply security is a national responsibility. Under Australia's fuel security arrangements, the Australian Government leads and coordinates the national response, including monitoring international market conditions, shipping movements and overall supply levels across the country.

Queensland continues to actively participate in national fuel security arrangements and has repeatedly called for improved transparency of national fuel supply data, including a national dashboard to provide consistent, public information.

For local information, Queensland Treasury provides the data for fuel price apps and websites so motorists can access fuel pricing and availability information. Queensland's fuel price reporting program requires all fuel retailers to update price and availability data within 30 minutes of any change, ensuring consumers have timely and accurate local information.
