MS J HOWARD ASKED MINISTER FOR POLICE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES (HON D PURDIE)—

QUESTION:

With reference to answer to Question on Notice No. 1329 of 2025—

Will the Minister advise the number and percentage of total assault victims with a domestic violence flag for the period 1 January 2024 to 31 January 2025, where the incident involved a parent-child relationship?

ANSWER:

I am advised by the Queensland Police Service (QPS) that the number and percentage of total assault victims with a domestic violence flag and involved a parent-child relationship for the period from 1 January 2024 to 31 January 2025 is outlined in the following table:

Notes:

1. This data is preliminary and may be subject to change.
2. Figures do not represent a unique person count as a person may be the victim of more than one offence in the period.
3. Relationship of offender to victim has been derived using the victim reports linked to the victim of an occurrence.
4. 'A parent-child relationship' includes either parent or child being the relationship of offender to victim.
5. The data is for victims of assault offences involving a parent-child relationship and may include children who are adults.
6. 'With DV Flag' refers to those where the domestic violence indicator was 'yes' and is based on the police officers' perception that domestic violence is happening, has happened or investigation reveals domestic violence may have happened.
7. Percentage is calculated as those involving a parent-child relationship and DV flag divided by total number of victims for assault offences.
