**HON S FENTIMAN** ASKED THE ATTORNEY-GENERAL AND MINISTER FOR JUSTICE AND MINISTER FOR INTEGRITY (HON D FRECKLINGTON)

**QUESTION:**

With reference to the Queensland Law Reform Commission 'Review of particular criminal defences: Just, clear and modern: Reformed criminal defences for Queensland'—

Will the Attorney-General advise,

- (a) when will the government be providing a response and
- (b) will the Attorney-General act on the recommendations and implement the reforms regarding provocation?

**ANSWER:**

The Crisafulli Government remains committed to prioritising the rights of victims.

While there is no legislative requirement under the Act to formally respond to the Report, the Crisafulli Government is committed to supporting victims of crime and delivering a fair and efficient justice system.

Consistent with this commitment, the recommendations of the Queensland Law Reform Commission will be carefully considered and where recommendations support victims of crime and make Queensland safer, the government will act on the recommendations and implement the reforms.
