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**QUESTION 1**

With reference to SDS 4-2 regarding the Parliamentary Service Management Plan 2011 – 2015 which outlines service goals to continue to develop strategies for the Parliament to engage with the Queensland community, what plans are there in place for this to occur during 2012?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

During 2011-12, the Queensland Parliament will expand further upon its current engagement and education programs which are aimed at raising awareness and participation in Queensland's system of democracy.

The Parliament's educational and engagement program, which includes school and public tours, youth parliaments and other parliamentary activities, continues to grow annually. During 2010-11, 1,863 tours were held at Parliament House for more than 25,500 people (including 18,159 students and 7,740 other visitors). Further, 116 parliamentary education activities occurred involving 5,519 people. This is in addition to the 2,357 students who participated in educational programs during the Mackay Regional sitting of Parliament. Other engagement activities, including the successful multi-faith service and citizenship ceremony, encouraged more than 3,500 Queenslanders to engage with their parliament.

The parliament also continued its successful public service training seminars holding 19 sessions at Parliament House, with another held in Mackay in the lead up to the regional parliamentary sitting. Almost 700 public servants participated in this important engagement activity with more than 98 per cent of participants rating the training positively. This program will again be facilitated during the forthcoming year with an additional program being implemented in 2012 to support the new parliamentary committee structure implemented with the *Parliament of Queensland (Reform and Modernisation) Amendment Act 2011*. This program will focus specifically on the operation of the new parliamentary committee structure and its implications for public sector officers.

As Members are aware, the Queensland Parliament recently launched a new user-friendly website. This project built upon the very popular broadcast on demand service launched in February. During 2011-12, the website will be improved further with updates to the parliament's committee pages and education resources. I am advised that over 17,500,000 page views occurred during 2010-11 and we are expecting even more in the upcoming year with the improved website and resources.

To celebrate the United Nations International Year of Youth, the Bayside Youth Parliament was held at Sheldon College on 21 October 2010. Over 350 students participated in this event with 90 students taking part in the youth parliament. Later, a successful teacher training session was also held. This model received positive feedback from teachers, students and the Members involved, as well as the media.

A similar combined model of engagement activities was successfully used during the lead-up to the Mackay regional sitting of Parliament, along with a public service seminar on that occasion. As a result of the success of this initiative, it is intended to stage further events based on this model during 2011-12.

During the year, the Parliament moved to further improve its engagement with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples. Participation in NAIDOC activities now occurs annually continuing our partnership with the Australian Electoral Commission and the Electoral Commission of Queensland to

host information stalls where the community can ask questions about the Parliament and the State and Federal electoral processes.

Further, parliamentary staff also met with the board of Apunipima, the Cape York Indigenous Health Council, and with the Indigenous Justice Group in Cairns who represent communities in the Cape York and Torres Strait areas. The aim of these activities is to ensure that the Queensland Parliament engages with Indigenous peoples in a culturally appropriate way in its decision-making, especially its future committee consultation processes.

Work on this developing strategy will continue through 2011-12 to support expected increased Indigenous engagement under the revised parliamentary committee system. Community Engagement Services will be working closely with the Committee Office to maximise participation by the general public and special interest groups in the process of examining proposed legislation by the new portfolio committees.

Recently, another successful Indigenous Youth Parliament was held in partnership with the Department of Communities. A further 35 Indigenous participants, adding to the 80 already involved in this program since it was first developed in 2009, were provided with a valuable opportunity to learn and increase their leadership, networking and decision-making skills. Due to the success of this program, the Australian Electoral Commission has asked our parliamentary staff to help facilitate a similar event during 2011-12 for all Australian states and territories in Canberra.

The parliament's highly successful High Teas continue to grow in prestige and popularity. Members may be interested to know that the Queensland Parliament's High Teas were recently listed in the top 20 dining rooms serving tea and cakes in Australia. Last year, 15 High Teas were held in the Strangers' Dining Room attended by more than 1,100 people and followed by a tour of the parliament. I understand that 80 members of the hearing-impaired community have booked a High Tea event in the upcoming year and we look forward to welcoming others in the community to partake in this unique experience. In all, more than 34,000 people enjoyed the high quality of catering available at the Queensland Parliament during the 795 events held in 2010-11. More events are expected to be supported in 2011-12.

It is expected that during this coming year the Queensland Parliament will further build upon its current engagement and education activities at both Parliament House and in regional locations throughout the state, in order to increase parliamentary education and awareness, but also to support enhanced engagement with the new parliamentary committees.

**QUESTION 2**

With reference to SDS 4 -3 regarding 2011-12 highlights where Parliamentary Service initiatives include developing and delivering a new training and development program for electorate office staff, will the Speaker detail what this will involve and how this will benefit Queenslanders?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

The 2011-2012 Budget includes an amount of \$75,000 for electorate office staff training.

The Human Resource Services unit within the Parliamentary Service will coordinate this training.

There are approximately 220 electorate office staff employed in 94 Members' offices across the State under various full-time and job sharing arrangements.

Over the past five years, the Parliamentary Service has delivered various training packages to electorate office staff. The provision of such training has been an agreed requirement under successive enterprise bargaining agreements.

Training over the last three years has focused on safety and security in electorate offices. The feedback from this training was very positive with a number of electorate office staff commenting that further, broad-based, on-going training programs would greatly assist staff to serve constituents.

In response to the above suggestions, a new electorate office staff training course will be delivered over the coming two years. It is expected that course content will cover:

- a) security and staff awareness training for new staff and update sessions for existing staff
- b) information concerning various support services regularly used by electorate office staff including the Parliamentary Library, Community Engagement and Information Technology Services
- c) skills development for staff in dealing with difficult constituents and complex constituent matters as well as briefings from relevant government agencies about hot topics
- d) employment information useful to electorate office staff (e.g., superannuation, salary sacrifice etc) as well as refresher sessions on workplace relations policies (e.g., code of conduct, workplace harassment etc)
- e) information and advice regarding the various administrative responsibilities and requirements of electorate office staff (e.g., understanding Members entitlements, making travel claims, managing office equipment and consumables).

To ensure that the training remains valuable and meets electorate office needs, final course content will be subject to consultation with electorate office staff. The delivery of training would continue to be via small group training sessions of 20–30 staff held over two to three days in Brisbane.

**Implementation schedule**

The training program will be developed during September and October 2011 before consultation with electorate office staff. A pilot program will take place before Christmas 2011. Timing for the remaining courses in 2011-2012 will be assessed taking into consideration the timing of the next General election.

**QUESTION 4**

With reference to SDS 4-4 regarding Parliamentary Precinct Support Services which delivers a range of services that directly support the activities of Members and their staff including information technology, human resources, financial and administrative services, will the Speaker provide details of some of the services which have been delivered to the Leader of the Opposition office and staff?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

The reference in SDS 4-4 regarding support for "Members and their staff" is particular to electorate office staff.

The Office of the Leader of the Opposition ("the Office") is funded and supported by the Department of the Premier and Cabinet which I understand provides information technology, human resource, financial and administrative support to the Office.

The Parliamentary Service provides no such administrative support to the Office.

The only services provided to staff of the Office relate to accommodation and access to the parliamentary precinct including car parking. Office staff are provided with:

- a) office accommodation on level 6 of the Annexe and some support for that accommodation (e.g., I recently approved the purchase of replacement chairs for the Office);
- b) staff car parking
- c) staff security access to the building and associated services

Office staff are not Parliamentary Service employees. I understand they are employed through Ministerial Services Branch of the Department of the Premier and Cabinet.

Staff from the Opposition Leader's Office are generally afforded the same access and support as Ministerial staff and also Department of Public Works contractors who are 'permanently' stationed within the precinct (e.g., cleaners and trade staff).

**QUESTION 5**

With reference to SDS 4-3 regarding the hosting of the 19th Commonwealth Parliamentary Association Australian and Pacific Region Seminar in September 2011, will the Speaker advise who will be attending, the approximate cost and any benefits which are received from hosting such an event?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

Under Commonwealth Parliamentary Association arrangements, the branches of the CPA are grouped geographically into eight regions.

The Australian Region comprises the Australian and state and territory parliaments, the Commonwealth of Australia Parliament. The Pacific Region includes the following parliaments:

The Australian and Pacific Regions hold a joint regional seminar every second year. At the conclusion of the 18<sup>th</sup> regional seminar in Wellington, New Zealand in 2009 it was agreed that the Queensland Branch would host the 19<sup>th</sup> seminar.

The 2011 seminar will be the first time the seminar has been hosted in Queensland since 1976. It is basically well past Queensland's turn to host the event.

A total of 29 members from the abovementioned parliaments are entitled to attend the conference as full participating delegates. There may also be some observers from parliaments attending. Acceptances will not close until the end of July.

The Australian branches and New Zealand contribute funds to cover most seminar and travel costs. Based on the experience of the 18<sup>th</sup> seminar in Wellington it is unlikely that the total contribution of the Queensland Parliament as host will be in excess of \$20,000. This will be funded through the CPA Queensland Branch budget.

The theme for the seminar is "Risk Management: recovery from natural disasters in the parliamentary context". It is envisaged that this topic will provide some useful exchanges of information and ideas between members across the Australian and Pacific region who have had to deal with an array of issues pertaining to natural disasters in recent years.

There are many benefits that flow from the Queensland Parliament's membership of the CPA and these types of events including the sharing of information and the building and maintenance of close working relationships with other jurisdictions, particularly our Pacific neighbours.

**QUESTION 6**

With reference to SDS 4-2, will the Speaker advise the total floor space available in the Parliamentary Annexe and how is it allocated, listed separately by type including but not limited to office space (committee, opposition, media, parliamentary support and other listed separately), parliamentary library, catering, accommodation, housekeeping, recreation, meeting rooms, conference rooms, media conference facilities, common areas and other (specified separately by type)?

**QUESTION 7**

With reference to SDS 4-2, will the Speaker detail what funding resources will be made available for each of the newly introduced committees for 2011-12?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE****Background**

On 19 May 2011, the *Parliament of Queensland (Reform and Modernisation) Amendment Act 2011* received assent. The Act provides for the Legislative Assembly to establish a number of portfolio committees.

On 16 June 2011, the House approved variations to Standing Orders to establish a number of specific portfolio committees.

The Queensland Parliament's Committee system now comprises:

- Finance and Administration Committee
- Legal Affairs, Police, Corrective Services and Emergency Services Committee
- Industry, Education, Training and Industrial Relations Committee
- Environment, Agriculture, Resources and Energy Committee
- Community Affairs Committee
- Health and Disabilities Committee
- Transport, Local Government and Infrastructure Committee
- Parliamentary Crime and Misconduct Committee
- Ethics Committee
- Committee of the Legislative Assembly.

As the committee is no doubt aware, the seven portfolio committees are also performing the role of Estimates Committees for the 2011-2012 Budget.

**Resourcing implications of the new committee system**

The introduction of the new committee system has (and will have) resourcing implications for two main reasons:

- a) Increased number of committees and therefore support staff
  - The new committee system has more committees than the previous system and so a number of additional staff will be required to provide support to those committees.
  - There are additional costs to be incurred associated with staffing (e.g., staff salaries, accommodation, computer and office equipment)
- b) Expanded committee activities
  - The activities of the new committees will require an investment in hearing and meeting rooms (e.g., including technology to enable more public hearings)
  - The activities of the new committees will also result in additional operating costs (e.g., additional printing, travel, consultant and advertising costs).

**Funding resources for committees in 2011-2012**

Because the final adoption of the new committee system occurred after the time when the Parliament's 2011-12 Budget was developed, approved and made ready for publication, there is no additional funding included in the 2011-2012 Budget for the new Committee system, that is:

- The Appropriation (Parliament) Bill does not include any additional funding for the new committee system
- There is no reference to additional funding in the Parliament's *Service Delivery Statements*

My understanding is that the Government has yet to consider or approve any additional funding for the new committee system. As a result, the total budget allocation for all Parliamentary Committees in 2011-2012 included in the *Service Delivery Statements* is the amount set aside for the former committee system, i.e., \$2.586M.

As I understand it, the Committee of the Legislative Assembly is to have responsibility for seeking additional funding for the new committee system and allocating budgets for each individual committee.

**QUESTION 8**

With reference to SDS 4-2, will the Speaker detail what arrangements have been made in regards to physical space for the newly introduced committees, including but not limited to arrangements for public hearings, meeting rooms and committee secretariat offices, reported separately by committee; and if any audit has been undertaken into the physical space requirements of these committees what was the result of this assessment?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE****Audit of space**

I have not made arrangements to conduct an "audit" in relation to the "physical space requirements of these committees", nor have I received a request to do so. I understand that assessing the requirements of the new committees was within the purview of the Committee of the Legislative Assembly and that committee has not contacted me requesting that an audit be conducted.

I can advise the committee that on 8 April 2011 I received advice that the Cabinet Budget Review Committee had approved funding for the Parliament of \$100,000 for the following purpose:

*Funding approved to undertake a business case to examine options for committee meeting space, for example relocation of corporate services. The Parliamentary Service is to work with the Department of Public Works to identify temporary meeting locations. A submission on the implementation of the Review is to be provided to the 2011-12 Mid-Year Review.*

I found this perplexing as I had not made a funding request to Government in relation to this funding or for any other accommodation related funding in the current year budget.

**Arrangements for committee secretariat offices**

What I can advise is that because of the limited time taken between the formal decision of the House to create the new parliamentary committee structure (16 June 2011) and the implementation of the structure (i.e., to be effective for the conduct of the 2011 Estimates Committee process) urgent interim action had to be taken in relation to accommodating additional staff associated with the new structure.

In April 2011, the Clerk of the Parliament conducted a scan of the precinct and recommended that the only viable temporary option to accommodate the proposed two additional secretariats was to utilise space currently occupied by two library compactus storage units on level 5 of the Annexe within the Information and Technology Services area. On 20 April 2011, the Clerk sought my urgent approval to conduct the necessary works on the precinct to accommodate the proposed two additional secretariats which I provided. I noted that there was no budget for these works but approved them on the basis that they were essential for the operation of the new committees and that correspondence would be prepared to the Treasurer in due course to seek re-imbursement for the costs incurred.

Secretariat staff supporting the committees are now located in the following areas within the Annexe and Parliament House:

### Arrangements for public hearings and meetings

I understand that on 14 June 2011 the Committee of the Legislative Assembly recommended the following room upgrade proposals to facilitate the new portfolio committee system:

- Seven rooms on the precinct (Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council Chambers, Undumbi, Dandiir and Members' Reading Rooms and the Premiers' and Speakers' Halls) to be upgraded with the requisite sound system (including audio, captioning and log noting functionality) for transcription of committee proceedings
- Three of those rooms (the Legislative Assembly and Legislative Council Chambers and Dandiir Room) to be upgraded with the capacity for video streaming broadcast of committee proceedings
- The Dandiir Room to be upgraded with permanent video conferencing facilities.

The Clerk again sought my urgent approval to conduct these necessary works as soon as possible which I provided on 17 June 2011.

I understand it is proposed that the hearing rooms are to be allocated to particular portfolio committees by the Manager, Committee Office on the basis of advice of the business to be conducted by each of those committees on any given Wednesday morning of a sitting week.

Again, I noted that there was no budget for these works but approved them on the basis that they were essential for the operation of the new committees and that correspondence would be subsequently prepared to the Treasurer seeking approval to commit capital works expenditure outside of the standard budget process.

**QUESTION 9**

With reference to SDS 4-2, will the Speaker advise what work has been undertaken into assessing the ideal solution required in terms of floor space for the new seven portfolio committees in terms of accommodation for both staff offices, meeting rooms and hearing rooms?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE****Work undertaken in 2009**

Action was taken in 2009 to conduct a *Strategic Review of Parliamentary Buildings* which considered the issue of providing ideal accommodation for an expanded committee system and committee office should it eventuate in the future.

That review indicated that the “ideal solution” to address not only the possibility of a new expanded committee structure requiring “staff offices, meeting rooms and hearing rooms”, but also other fitness for purpose accommodation pressures within both parliamentary buildings, was to investigate construction of a new building adjacent to the Annexe.

The Strategic Review suggested that the three-level building could accommodate:

- a new Community Engagement and Parliamentary Education Office
- new committee office accommodation including staff offices, meeting rooms and public hearing rooms
- new office accommodation for the Office of the Leader of the Opposition.

It is worth noting that this review documented the accommodation problems within the precinct and proposed solutions well before the current interest in accommodation arising out of the introduction of the new committee system.

I understand a copy of the relevant section of the *Strategic Review of Parliamentary Buildings* document (Report 2 – Fitness for Purpose Report) was provided to the Committee System Review Committee which in its report supported the recommendations contained in it.

**Work to be undertaken in 2011-2012**

As I noted in my previous answer, I can advise that on 8 April 2011 I received advice that the Cabinet Budget Review Committee had approved funding for the Parliament of \$100,000 for the following purpose:

*Funding approved to undertake a business case to examine options for committee meeting space, for example relocation of corporate services. The Parliamentary Service is to work with the Department of Public Works to identify temporary meeting locations. A submission on the implementation of the Review is to be provided to the 2011-12 Mid-Year Review.*

I had not made a funding request to Government in relation to this funding or for any other accommodation related funding in the current year budget.

I presume that the Committee of the Legislative Assembly will give carriage to the above review when it assumes responsibility for the Parliamentary Service and accommodation.



**QUESTION 10**

With reference to SDS 4-2, will the Speaker advise of any work that has been done or any estimates undertaken into any options to expand the floor space available in the Parliamentary Annexe and, if so, will the Speaker advise the details?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

See answers to Questions 8 and 9.

**QUESTION 11**

With reference to SDS 4-2, will the Speaker advise if there has been any comparison, study or other such work been done by Parliamentary Services or the Speaker regarding the provision of onsite accommodation for MPs versus the payment of a reasonable travel allowance to MPs as exists in other Australian Parliaments as well as the Queensland Public Service and, if so, will the Speaker advise of the results and/or findings of this work?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

Prior to receiving this question, I have had this issue raised with me on only one occasion previously.

In 2010, the Speaker's Advisory Committee (SAC) received briefings regarding the *Strategic Review of Parliamentary Buildings* which had been conducted by the Parliamentary Service in 2009.

Specifically, SAC was briefed regarding Report 2 of the Strategic Review (Fitness for Purpose). This particular report highlighted a number of accommodation problems within the precinct and made recommendations to address them.

During the first briefing (20 May 2010), a SAC member raised the issue of whether the review had considered the issue of the on-going viability of providing overnight accommodation for Members and whether an allowance could be provided in lieu of this accommodation, thus releasing overnight accommodation floors in the Annexe for other purposes. The Member was advised that the report had not considered this option and that the review had assumed, based on experience, that the Annexe would continue to be used for Members' accommodation.

At the second briefing (10 June 2010) the Member who had raised the matter during the previous meeting advised the committee that he no longer wished to pursue the matter and that he supported the report's recommendations being progressed by the Speaker in due course.

As a result, I took no action to investigate the issue further.

I understand from the Clerk that around this time the Clerk asked officers from the Corporate Services Division to make enquiries of allowances provided in other jurisdiction without on-site accommodation.

Since receiving this Question on Notice (and while this matter does not relate to the Parliament's current appropriation) I have asked the Parliamentary Service to renew the examination of accommodation allowance arrangements in other jurisdictions.

Information has not been obtained from every Australian jurisdiction. However, the information gathered has, as expected, illustrated a diverse range of approaches to providing Members with accommodation allowances, unique to the requirements of their particular jurisdiction.

In general terms, the schemes adopted in other jurisdictions provide for a set allowance (paid on either a per night basis or annual basis in advance) to compensate Members for accommodation and meal costs they incur where they are required to visit their capital city for parliamentary business.

The various schemes provide for:

- overnight allowances, ranging between \$200 and \$250 per night
- an eligibility criteria based on electorate distance from capital cities of 30-75 km (with certain exemptions in some jurisdictions for the Premier, Ministers, Leader of the Opposition, etc)
- a maximum number of nights claimable ranging from 100 to 180 nights per annum
- a requirement for Members to annually certify as to the business conducted for each night claimed.

Based upon the information available, the estimated cost of adopting a similar scheme with similar criteria for the Queensland Parliament might range between \$1.2M and \$1.8M per annum.

Bearing the above in mind, I would now like to discuss the broader thrust of this question, i.e., a comparison of the relative merits of the provision of on-site accommodation for MPs versus the payment of a reasonable travel allowance to MPs.

In essence, what is being requested here is a cost benefit analysis of these two options. In order to undertake an effective cost benefit analysis, one must ensure that all the costs/benefits are included, and each cost benefit is properly quantified.

So, for example, if we were to consider a cost benefit analysis of the current arrangements (i.e., where on-site overnight accommodation is provided), the cost and benefits would include (at a minimum) the following:

However, it is not possible to undertake an effective cost benefit analysis of these options because at this stage there are too many variables and unknowns. These include:

What model for allowance payments would apply?

The actual amount of travelling allowance costs that will be incurred is unknown because no model has been determined. For example:

- Will all 89 MPs receive an accommodation allowance, or will only the 80 Members who are currently provided with a bedroom receive the allowance; or will new eligibility rules be established based upon the distance of the MP's electorate from Brisbane?
- Whether it would be an all in or all out scheme or a hybrid scheme with some members being able to choose to take the on-site accommodation or an allowance. (The ability to make savings of fixed costs would be reduced under a hybrid scheme, because under such a model it may not be possible to reduce costs in areas such as security, catering etc.)
- What will be the number of days per annum that an MP is able to claim (60 days, 120 days or more)?
- What will be the rate of the allowance (\$240, \$260, \$280 per overnight stay?)
- What would be the substantiation requirements?

b) What exact purpose would the vacated space be put to?

The conversion of the space to an alternative usage would obviously result in a capital cost. This must be factored into the cost benefit analysis.

The precise purpose for which it would be used would also have implications for recurrent costs (cleaning, servicing, maintenance) depending upon the new purpose. For example the cost of maintaining offices is different from maintaining large meeting rooms or common areas.

c) How would the loss of accommodation amenity for Members be quantified?

The loss of convenience to Members would be significant – how would this be quantified? It would need to be quantified differently for different MPs, depending upon their own personal circumstances and parliamentary and or executive responsibilities.

It is not until these matters have been discussed in more detail and some threshold decisions taken that a true cost benefit analysis could be undertaken.

**QUESTION 12**

With reference to SDS 4-2, will the Speaker advise if any work has been undertaken into any option of converting existing MP accommodation rooms into office, meeting, committee or hearing rooms?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

As outlined in my answers to previous questions:

- a) I have not instructed that any such work on this option be undertaken
- b) I note that I have received advice that the Cabinet Budget Review Committee (without any submission by me or discussion with me) has approved funding for the Parliament of \$100,000 *to undertake a business case to examine options for committee meeting space, for example relocation of corporate services* and that the *Parliamentary Service is to work with the Department of Public Works to identify temporary meeting locations.*

Notwithstanding the matters I raised in my answer to Question on Notice Number 11, I believe there are a number of inherent constraints in converting accommodation floors for the purposes outlined in the question. These constraints relate to the original building design:

**The relatively small size of bedrooms floors**

Bedroom and office floors in the upper Annexe are significantly smaller in size than lower level floors such as level 6. For example, level 14 has an area of approximately 400m<sup>2</sup> compared to more than 3,000 m<sup>2</sup> on level 6.

This means that clearing and refurbishing level 14 would realise a relatively small amount of space (equivalent roughly to the size of the current Opposition Office on level 6). Levels 15 through 18 are only marginally larger at around 500m<sup>2</sup> per floor (because these floors were designed to accommodate the ministerial suites).

In other words, the accommodation value of converting such floors (i.e., the space realised for the conversion investment) may be quite limited.

**The unusual shape of bedroom floors**

Because these floors were specifically designed for overnight accommodation, the floors are long and narrow. The practical usability of this space may be limited.

This shape would present some challenges when converting to open plan office space and it may be difficult or impractical to install larger meeting rooms due, for example, to the location of supporting pillars.

**The requirement for new services if use changes**

Each of these floors currently utilise individual air-conditioning units located in each bedroom. If the floors were cleared and made ready for another purposes, larger air-conditioning services would need to be located somewhere (perhaps a plant room similar to level 8 would have to be constructed on one of the vacated floors). This may mean a large loss of space to services.

**The increased pressure on lifts**

The more people that are located above level 6, the greater the pressure on the high-rise lifts.

The current performance of the high rise lifts (which is a topic of regular complaint by Members) would be reduced in the event of staff and perhaps members of the public accessing floors above level 9.

**Move away from the original compartmental design of the building**

As the 2009 *Strategic Review of Parliamentary Buildings* noted, the original compartmental design of the building was very effective but has been adversely affected by ad hoc decision making over the last 30 years.

It has had a particular impact on levels 3 to 6 which were originally designed as the public and common area floors of the building.

Aside from the impact on services (such as lifts) already outlined above, the use of the tower for persons other than Members and possibly the public may have security and privacy implications for Members, jeopardising the original intent of the compartmental design.

**QUESTION 13**

With reference to SDS 4-2, will the Speaker advise the actual cost of maintaining the Parliamentary precinct, broken down separately into Parliament House and the Parliamentary Annexe, with major costs listed separately?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

Before providing my response, there are a number of important points to note here:

**a) Defining “maintenance”**

The term “maintenance” can have different meanings to different people. For example, some may consider the cost of maintaining the precinct to include things such as the cost of electricity, local government rates and other utilities; repairing the stonework; cleaning rooms within the buildings; and replacing water or sewerage pipes.

For accounting purposes, however, the above costs are not considered “maintenance”. The information I provide in my answer will utilise the accepted public sector accounting definition of maintenance.

**b) Reporting maintenance broken down separately into Parliament House and the Parliamentary Annexe**

Current accounting and reporting arrangements in place do not allow me to report *all* maintenance costs separately by building because the Parliamentary Service does not always capture costs separately by building. Where information by building is available, I have provided it.

**c) The “actual cost”**

Finally, the question asks for “actual costs” which suggests a request for information concerning costs incurred in 2010-11. I note that because the 2010-2011 year has not yet closed for accounting purposes, there are still a number of accounts that have yet to be received and/or processed.

To assist the committee, I have estimated actual costs where it is reasonable to do so accurately.

The following table summarises maintenance costs (actual and estimated) for 2010-2011.

**Notes**

1. Service maintenance is designed to retain an item or asset in its original condition as far as practicable by providing systematic inspection, detection and prevention of incipient failure. Service maintenance may be mandatory (required to meet various Building Acts, Regulations or other statutory obligations) or non-mandatory.

Service maintenance is delivered primarily by primarily private sector contractors (contracted via an actual Service Maintenance Contract). Service Maintenance Contracts cover a wide range of maintenance demands, including-

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The remaining service maintenance is delivered by DPW on-site trade staff.

2. Condition-based maintenance is that required to restore asset to required condition standard, usually identified through specific condition assessment/inspection process. These "condition assessments" usually classify maintenance according to "building elements" such as finishes (e.g. painting walls and ceilings) services (e.g. maintaining chilled water pipes) and structure (e.g. carrying out repairs to the swimming pool).

Costs incurred for *Condition Based Maintenance* in 2010-2011 were significantly less than budgeted. For example, the budget for *Condition Based Maintenance* in Parliament House included an allocation of \$294,000 to commence the interior painting. However, progress for this project was slower than originally planned.

3. Repairs/rectification works and minor works involve actual repair to the building, infrastructure or plant and equipment for example carpentry repairs such as broken furniture, locks; plumbing repairs such as broken underground pipes, tap washers, leaks; electrical repairs such as lights, switches; and refrigeration repairs such as air-conditioning, food refrigerators. Repairs can also be required to some items that are not otherwise covered by existing service maintenance contracts (eg sound system microphone repairs/replacement, fire hydrant/pump repairs). Works can also include items such as undertaking minor office renovations where not deemed capital works (labour and materials); or assisting with major function set-up such as the Opening of Parliament (labour and materials).

A significant amount of these types of works are delivered by on-site DPW trade staff (\$558,757) but private sector contractors were also engaged to perform some works (\$229,873). There were also building materials purchased to deliver some of these works (\$41,408).



**QUESTION 14**

With reference to SDS 4-6, will the Speaker detail in relation to the number of catered functions held, how much revenue was raised by these functions and how were these funds expended?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

The Legislative Assembly and Parliamentary Service offers function and catering services to a range of clients including Members, Parliamentary Service internal clients (Education Services, Parliamentary Committees, etc), Ministerial Offices, government departments, and a range of external clients (including business and community organisations).

The catering services provided may range from a simple lunch menu for 4-6 guests to large catered events for hundreds of guests.

In the 2010-11 year, a total of 795 catered functions were held, delivering total revenue of \$1.023M (excluding GST).

This revenue from catered functions is used solely for the purpose of meeting costs incurred in delivering the full range of catering services on the precinct including the purchase of food and beverages consumed, the employment of additional temporary and casual staff, the payment of overtime for existing staff, and other costs such as linen and laundry.

Any "profit" from the function trade is essentially used to offset the cost of less profitable catering activity.

**QUESTION 15**

With reference to SDS 4-3, will the Speaker detail, in relation to the replacement of electorate office computer equipment and upgrade of Internet bandwidth in all electorate offices, what was the total cost and, by electorate office, list each completion date and the internet bandwidth now available?

**SPEAKER'S RESPONSE**

All electorate office desktop computers and data communication systems were upgraded in the later half of 2010. The planning, development, testing, documentation and implementation phases of the project occurred over the preceding 18 months.

Each electorate office was visited by Information Technology Services staff during the rollout period between September 20 and December 10, 2010. During this visit, new office computers and other local area network equipment were installed and the old computers decommissioned. Office staff received familiarisation training with the new computer equipment, the Windows 7 operating system and the new and enhanced features of the latest solution.

The new data communications system provided an upgrade of the standard 1.5MB/256KB ADSL Service to the fastest available broadband service within the constraints of the electorate office's geographical location and available internet service. As a result of the upgrade, 40 offices were upgraded to an ADSL2+ service while the remaining offices were upgraded to an enhanced ADSL.

As many variables affect the true performance of any broadband service, it is not possible to provide an accurate and reliable performance throughput figure for each service. However, the following page summarises the nominal link description for each service as well as the results of the ISP tested download and upload speeds at the time of commissioning.

I can confirm however that the throughput performance of all new broadband services is faster than the pre-existing service.

The cost of providing the new computer system and improved broadband was \$617,780.29, including:

- hardware (including maintenance) and software      \$ 545,350.60
- ADSL upgrade      \$ 50,000.00
- travel, freight and other miscellaneous costs      \$ 22,429.69

As this work did not involve any contractors or other non-Parliamentary Service personnel, the cost of the staff resources involved in these phases is not included in the above costs.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-3 regarding the management of the Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal, will the Premier provide details on the amount of money raised by the appeal and how many people and households have received assistance?

**ANSWER:**

As at 8 July 2011, total donations to the Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal had reached \$273.1 million, including interest. The generosity of Queensland families and businesses, fellow Australians and people from around the world is remarkable, particularly given the devastating disasters experienced by our neighbouring states and countries in recent months.

To date, the Appeal Fund has distributed a total of \$180.4 million. More than 40,000 individuals have directly received donations from the Fund totalling \$170.4 million, money that will make a difference to those who endured these devastating events.

All of these needy Queenslanders received Round 1 payments, regardless of income. Initial payments were provided to anybody with flood or cyclone damage in their living space and were not means tested.

The Appeal Fund's first round of relief funding was announced by the Honourable Dr David Hamill AM, Chair of the independent Distribution Committee, on 20 January 2011. Within six working days from the commencement of this round, the first payments were made. Between 31 January 2011 and 30 June 2011, the Fund has subsequently distributed more than \$1.06 million each day. In the past week, approximately \$2.31 million has been distributed each day.

In Round 2, payments of between \$25,000 and \$180,000 have been made to 302 households who had their homes destroyed as a result of the floods or Cyclone Yasi. A total of \$18.52 million has been distributed to Round 2 applicants.

In Round 3, payments of between \$10 000 and \$90 000 have been made to 2,467 households whose homes were severely damaged by these disasters. A total of \$80.02 million has been distributed to Round 3 applicants.

A further \$10 million has been allocated to St Vincent de Paul to help individuals or families who are experiencing significant and continuing hardship and have limited capacity to recover without assistance.

Special grants of \$35 000 are also being offered to victims of the inland tsunami that swept the Lockyer Valley, to assist victims relocate their principal place of residence to higher ground above the 2011 flood level, through a coordinated land swap.

Queenslanders can be assured that every single cent of money donated to the Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal will be used to help Queenslanders get their lives back on track.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-3 regarding the provision of support and assistance for the Queensland Reconstruction effort, will the Premier provide an outline on the support and assistance being provided to families, communities and businesses to assist them to recover and rebuild?

**ANSWER:**

The Queensland Reconstruction Authority was established on 21 February 2011 as a statutory authority for the efficient and effective coordination of reconstruction effort.

In under five months, significant progress has been made in the reconstruction, affirming the Government's commitment to make the support of families, communities and businesses its highest priority. Since February, the Authority has;

Undertaken the detailed planning required to build it back better;

- Developed a State-wide strategic plan, *Operation Queenslander*, to provide direction and oversee the implementation of the many tasks involved in the reconstruction and recovery process.
- Utilised its powers to fast track a new Development Scheme for the Grantham Reconstruction Area, working closely with Lockyer Valley Regional Council.
- Facilitated the delivery of the *Cassowary Coast Support Package*, providing up to \$15 million to repair the Dunk Island jetty, the Clump Point jetty and restore the Cardwell beach foreshore and its natural vegetation.
- Released guidelines for rebuilding in storm tide prone areas, focusing on Tully Heads/ Hull Heads, in partnership with Cassowary Coast Regional Council, the Cyclone Testing Station at James Cook University, CSIRO, the Australian Institute of Architects and GHD.
- Developed *Build Back – the rebuilding navigator*, a user-friendly website to help people navigate through the complex process of rebuilding their homes

Moved quickly to activate a raft of assistance programs;

- Activating Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA) payments, including *Emergency Assistance Grants* provided to 55,798 applicants, totalling \$19.9 million and *Essential Household Contents Grants* provided to 10,559 applicants, totalling \$15.1 million.
- Delivering QRAA grants to 4,572 small businesses, totalling \$38.9 million and 6,141 primary producers totalling \$45.8 million.
- Providing 225 not-for-profit community groups with grants totalling \$1.6 million.
- Allocating \$20 million for the *Rural Resilience Package* to assist in the recovery of rural economies and communities impacted by Cyclone Yasi through the funding of industry recovery officers, farm and waterway clean ups, counselling and education support services, with \$5.9 million provided to date to the Operation Clean Up teams;

- Providing \$36 million for the *Community Recovery and Well-being Package* which will assist with community development and recovery; mental health disaster recovery; and financial counselling; and
- Providing \$38 million under the *Mental Health Natural Disaster Recovery Plan* which will recruit 126 temporary community mental health staff across the State to provide specialist counselling and therapy services, assisting those experiencing the most severe psychological trauma.
- Coordinating the *Join Forces* Program, matching donations from corporations, individuals and philanthropists with affected community organisations. To date 176 community organisation have registered with Join Forces for assistance, and 293 corporate donor matches have been made. An estimated \$4.8 million worth of corporate financial pledges have been committed.

Implemented a \$6.8 Billion Reconstruction Budget, with infrastructure funding arrangements to repair and rebuild communities including:

- Overseeing the immediate recovery of approximately 92% of all damaged State and Federal road network, and over 93% of all damaged rail network.
- Allocating \$2.9 billion for state controlled roads;
- Allocating \$2.7 billion for local government assets, with more than \$450 million in advance NDRRA payments made to Councils to date.
- Providing \$330 million in exceptional circumstances funding under the *Queensland Local Council Package*, to fast track repairs to previously non-NDRRA eligible local government infrastructure, including water and sewerage, Brisbane's ferry terminals and Riverwalk, and repairs to the Rockhampton Airport.
- Providing \$14.5 million for the *Sport Flood Fight Back Scheme*, which will assist sport and recreation organisations to re-establish programs and activities to ensure local communities can continue participating in sport, recreation and social interaction. To date \$13.5 million has been allocated under the Scheme, with 565 grants provided to sporting clubs.
- Providing \$11.6 million for land and water management initiatives which will include restoring gauging stations, clearing debris and material from high-risk areas of State land and the restoration and recovery of critical infrastructure throughout national parks and state forests; and
- Matching the donation of \$30 million by the United Arab Emirates with \$30 million in State funding for the construction of ten additional Category 5 cyclone shelters, which will also serve as multi-purpose facilities for year-round community use.

Supported the recovery of the State's economy and its industries through;

- \$83 million in the *Queensland Natural Disaster Jobs and Skills Package* which will assist approximately 10,000 Queenslanders by providing employment and work experience opportunities, apprentice and trainee support and training to address priority skills development. To date \$31.7 million has been allocated to assist 2,750 individuals and businesses through approved projects and jobs;
- \$13 million for the *Tourism Industry Support Package* which includes the 'Nothing Beats Queensland' campaign, aimed at encouraging domestic and international visitors back to Queensland.
- Promotion of the BSA's Disaster Recovery register of local licensed builders, suppliers and contractors whose services are available in the rebuild.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-3 regarding the provision of support and assistance for the Queensland Reconstruction effort, how many councils have received NDRRA funding and how much have they received in advance payments?

**ANSWER:**

As at 28 June 2011, the Queensland Reconstruction Authority (the Authority) had provided 56 Queensland local governments, impacted by recent natural disasters, with more than \$450 million in grant advance funding to ensure reconstruction works are not delayed by liquidity or cash-flow problems.

This is the first time since NDRRA arrangements began that local governments have received such funding up front. Previously, reimbursement of funding was provided following the completion of projects, with local governments receiving reimbursement for costs incurred.

The provision of advance payments allows councils to immediately undertake eligible reconstruction works with the knowledge that NDRRA funding is available, minimising project risk.

In total, the 2011-12 Budget outlines more than \$2.7 Billion in funding to be provided to local governments to meet the overall cost of reconstruction.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-15 where it lists the number of event activities organised, will the Premier outline what the purpose of the Building Revival Forum was and are there any outcomes from the event?

**ANSWER:**

In response to the downturn being experienced by the Queensland building and construction industry following the global financial crisis, I announced that the Government would hold a Building Revival Forum to discuss the challenges faced and to focus on the solutions required to kick-start this important industry.

The Building Revival Forum held on 12 April 2011 provided the opportunity for more than 150 key building industry participants to collectively discuss ideas that would help the industry regain momentum.

The Forum generated 115 ideas to support growth in the building industry and help it regain momentum. Forum participants indicated strong support for short-term economic boosts to help the industry, as well as long term improvements to housing affordability and planning and development assessment processes.

My Government made a commitment at the forum to review all the ideas, in consultation with industry organisations and local government, to finalise actions for implementation.

Many of ideas raised at the forum are already being addressed through my Government's current programs. These include improvements to the infrastructure charges system and significant planning system reforms.

The Government responded further in the 2011-12 Budget, providing;

- The \$140 million Queensland Building Boost, a \$10,000 grant for six months from 1 August 2011 for anyone building or buying a new house or unit valued at up to \$600,000;
- Additional funding of \$4.2 million in 2011-12 and \$1.8 million per annum from 2012-13 for a number of initiatives arising from the Building Revival Forum, including;
  - The establishment of a Major Projects Office to help guide significant projects through the planning and development approval processes
  - contributing up to \$2 million to a Development Assessment Process Reform Program lead by the Council of Mayors (SEQ) to help improve the way local government manages planning and development assessment processes and timeframes;
  - Further investigation of proposals relating to alternative dispute resolution and greater use of self certification for operational works.

A range of other key actions were released on 14 June as part of the Government Response to the Building Revival Forum, including;

- reviewing the implementation progress of the Sustainable Planning Act 2009 to identify benefits achieved and any barriers and impediments that need to be addressed.
- investigating the feasibility of establishing a new dispute resolution process such as a development assessment appeals tribunal as a cost effective and faster alternative to the Planning and Environment Court;
- drawing on learnings from the Urban Land Development Authority that could inform future amendments to planning legislation; and
- supporting the delivery of mixed lot sizes in planning schemes to help developers deliver an affordable range of housing products.

All of these actions will support an industry that is still recovering from the effects of the global financial crisis.

Our building revival actions have a dual focus; providing the short-term stimulus required to generate demand in the building and construction industry, while setting the foundations for the future through long-term improvements to the planning and development approval system in Queensland.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-4, in relation to the People's Question Time, will the Premier explain how the government delivered and promoted this initiative to encourage members of the public to ask the Premier and panelists their questions?

**ANSWER:**

The Government has continued to deliver regular People's Question Time sessions to give Queenslanders the chance to put their questions directly to me, my Ministers and representatives of other agencies in an open public format.

People's Question Time is streamed live, using the internet as the main mechanism for engaging with people.

This means that Queenslanders, no matter where they live, can put their questions forward. Anyone can then tune in online to watch the live and unedited panel discussion during which I and other panelists answer as many questions as possible in the allotted time. All questions are selected by an independent moderator – I do not see any questions before the forum nor do other panelists.

A total of seven People's Question Time sessions have now been held. It is estimated that a total of 440 people have attended sessions and a further 6,480 people have watched the live webcasts, with 20-30 public questions answered per session.

To encourage members of the public to ask their questions, we employ a variety of advertising and promotional methods.

For example, we advertise each upcoming People's Question Time in relevant newspapers, including regional newspapers as well as The Courier-Mail.

In advance of each session we also advertise online on major news websites, including The Courier-Mail and Brisbane Times, to encourage people to click through and submit their questions

To reach an even wider audience, we make use of social media such as Facebook and Twitter to announce upcoming sessions, invite questions and remind people to watch online.

We also invite representatives from relevant community groups and organisations to attend each People's Question Time as part of the audience. This not only gives the representatives a chance to ask a question in-person and listen to the discussion, but it also ensures those with a strong interest in the issue are aware of the opportunity and can subsequently encourage their members and contacts to take part online.

Finally, to ensure everyone has opportunities to ask questions, we offer a dedicated email subscription service for anyone interested in receiving news and reminders about People's Question Time. Members of the public can subscribe online at the Queensland Government's website.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-4 regarding recent achievements in relation to the protection of North Stradbroke Island, will the Premier outline the progress made on resolving native title issues on Stradbroke Island and what it means for the Quandamooka people?

**ANSWER:**

A key objective of my Government's North Stradbroke Island Strategy has been to achieve the resolution of native title through an Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA).

With the full support of the Queensland Government, the Federal Court of Australia determined on 4 July 2011 that the Quandamooka People are the native title holders of North Stradbroke Island and surrounding waters, recognising their long and enduring connection with the lands and seas of the island. The determination by the Federal Court recognises exclusive native title rights and interests over approximately 2,264 hectares of land; non-exclusive native title rights and interests over approximately 22,639 hectares of land, as well as approximately 29,505 hectares of the Moreton Bay Marine Park area.

The Queensland Government and the Quandamooka People have worked hard for many years to achieve this, and I congratulate the Quandamooka people on this outcome and thank them for their willingness to negotiate and their patience.

In addition to the native title determination the Quandamooka People and the Queensland Government have also agreed on an ILUA and an Indigenous Management Agreement (IMA) over lands and waters within the determination areas. These agreements provide for the resolution of land tenure issues on the island, provide the Quandamooka people with opportunities for land ownership and enshrine their participation in the management of their traditional country. They also provide the framework for an ongoing productive and cooperative relationship between the State and the Quandamooka people.

The settlement of the Quandamooka people's native title claim establishes a new model for tenure and protected area status in South-East Queensland through the creation of indigenous joint management areas. These areas will coexist with protected areas in the North Stradbroke Island Region that are also Aboriginal freehold land.

Aboriginal freehold land will be granted to the Quandamooka people for several purposes. The granting of Aboriginal land means that the Quandamooka people will be formally recognised as the rightful landholders of that land as well as having access to, and involvement in, the management of country. The contribution that this makes directly to the Traditional Owners and to the greater community should not be underestimated.

Delivering land justice for the Quandamooka people and creating a world class protected area on North Stradbroke Island have been priorities for my Government and what has been achieved is an important legacy for future generations.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-4 regarding recent achievements on the PNG Hydro project, will the Premier give the committee an update on the project?

**ANSWER:**

On 15 September 2010, I signed a Memorandum of Cooperation (MOC) with the Government of Papua New Guinea (PNG), PNG Energy Developments Ltd and Origin Energy to support the development of the Purari Hydro Resource at Wabo in the Gulf Province of PNG.

The project has enormous potential benefits for both PNG and Australia, economically, environmentally and socially..

It is projected to be able 485 megawatts of generation capacity to PNG – doubling the current supply in PNG - helping to drive significant economic and social development opportunities for PNG.

At the same time through a transmission line that would traverse the Torres Strait, Cape York and connect at Townsville with the Australian National Energy Market it could provide up to 1200 megawatts of long-term affordable base load renewable electricity for Far North and North West Queensland.

For Queensland this will open up of a range of industry, renewable energy and other development options in Far North Queensland and the North West minerals province.

Benefits include increased employment associated with the construction of a multi-billion dollar transmission line as well as helping Queensland avoiding 8 million tonnes of greenhouse gas emissions annually, which would help achieve the key Toward Q2 green target of cutting Queensland's carbon footprint by one third.

Feasibility studies have begun and are being conducted by consortium of AECOM, Electricity de France, Entura and ERM. Project feasibility studies are expected to be completed in 2012, including comprehensive environmental, sociological and engineering studies.

A working group of Senior Queensland Government officers and the project proponents has been established to gain a better understanding of both the scope and schedule of the Wabo project, and the progress of feasibility studies. PNG Government and Commonwealth Government officials have also been invited to attend.

Once feasibility has been established by the project's proponents, the State Government will through the Coordinator General process help facilitate the transmission line corridor and resolution of tenure issues, as well as working with the Commonwealth Government to co-ordinate the approval process and ultimately facilitating connection to the national electricity grid.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-34 where it states there will be an investment in Events Queensland Regional Development Program to extend the flow of economic and social benefits of events to the regions giving a boost to local communities, will the Premier detail some of the regional events that will be rolled out over the coming year and what community benefits are anticipated as a result?

**ANSWER:**

The Events Queensland Regional Development Program (EQRDP) is an investment program designed to extend the flow of economic and social benefits of events to regional Queensland.

This year's Budget takes the annual funding for EQRDP from \$2.4 million to \$3 million, acknowledging the Program's vital role in supporting more than 100 events in communities all over Queensland each year

The program supports a diverse portfolio of events which help to attract a continuous stream of interstate and international visitors to the state. At the same time, events raise the profile of Queensland nationally and overseas, encouraging future tourism and investment.

In collaboration with local councils and Regional Tourist Organisations (RTOs), EQRDP supports a diverse range of events which showcase our regions, attract visitors and enhance their experience, and retain valuable tourism dollars within the region and state.

Events Queensland has created the most comprehensive portfolio of supported events of any state in Australia. Since 2001 the Regional Development program has invested over \$17.5 million across 815 events. The Regional Program covers events held outside of the Brisbane region.

The events supported under this program range from music, fishing and food festivals, to camel races, kite surfing and cultural celebrations.

In 2010-2011 a total of 103 events received funding support totalling \$1,855,180.

Examples of some of these events are:

**The Abbey Medieval Festival – Caboolture**

The Abbey Medieval Festival is a week-long event that features a traditional banquet, a medieval themed children's fun day and culminates with a weekend tournament. In 2010, approximately 24,000 people including 800 re-enactors took part in the festival. The Tournament highlights many aspects of medieval life, from mock battles and jousting to drama, music, craft and dance. The Abbey Museum seeks through the Abbey Medieval Festival to offer the public a cultural and educational experience that demonstrates the significant impact the Middle Ages had on civilisation. The festival provides a fabulous "Living History" experience that is both entertaining and enjoyable.

### **Apple & Grape Harvest 2012 - Stanthorpe**

2/3/2012-4/3/2012

Round 20 - \$15,000 investment

Stanthorpe – population of approx 4,000

Event Attracts approx 60,000 to 80,000 people.

A three day biennial celebration of the Granite Belt region's booming horticultural, wine and tourism industries. Events include Apple Day, Sports Activities, Seniors Concert, Grand Ball, Grand Parade, Queensland Grape Crushing Competition, Street and Market stalls, Wine and Multicultural Food Fiesta, Pipe and Brass Bands, Fireworks, Open Garden in stages, Quilting Competition, Fun Run, Children activities in the park and a variety of entertainment for all ages.

This event receives the support required to run an event of this size from its community as all businesses and residents are involved in some aspect.

### **Wide Bay Australia International Airshow 2011**

19/08/2011 - 21/08/2011

Round 20 - \$100,000 investment

Bundaberg – population of approx 60,000

Projected attendance at the 2011 event is over 25,000, after the 2009 event attracted 22,000 people over 3 days.

The Airshow is a three day extravaganza for the aviation industry and aviation enthusiasts featuring aircraft from a bygone era, including aircraft from WWII, right up to the present day. Held from Friday to Sunday, the first day is a Trade Show which supports the growing Wide Bay aviation industry. Saturday and Sunday are devoted to aerobatic and other displays of aircraft from pre-war through to the latest RAAF aircraft such as the Super Hornet. The Airshow is the largest event to be held in Bundaberg contributing substantially to accommodation and tourism revenue throughout the Wide Bay region including the North Burnett, South Burnett, Fraser Coast (Hervey Bay) and the Bundaberg region.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-5 and the drafting of legislation for the protection of North Stradbroke Island, will the Premier provide an update of progress since the legislation was passed?

**ANSWER:**

The *North Stradbroke Island Protection and Sustainability Act 2011* received assent on 14 April 2011. The Act now provides a clear timetable to end all mining on the island and establishes a framework for Indigenous joint management of protected areas in the North Stradbroke Island region.

A key objective of my Government's North Stradbroke Island Strategy has been to achieve the resolution of native title through an Indigenous Land Use Agreement (ILUA).

With the full support of the Queensland Government, the Federal Court of Australia determined on 4 July 2011 that the Quandamooka People are the native title holders of North Stradbroke Island and surrounding waters, recognising their long and enduring connection with the lands and seas of the island. The determination by the Federal Court recognises exclusive native title rights and interests over approximately 2,264 hectares of land; non-exclusive native title rights and interests over approximately 22,639 hectares of land, as well as approximately 29,505 hectares of the Moreton Bay Marine Park area.

The Queensland Government and the Quandamooka People have worked hard for many years to achieve this, and I congratulate the Quandamooka people on this outcome and thank them for their willingness to negotiate and their patience.

In addition to the native title determination the Quandamooka People and the Queensland Government have also agreed on an ILUA and an Indigenous Management Agreement (IMA) over lands and waters within the determination areas. These agreements provide for the resolution of land tenure issues on the island, provide the Quandamooka people with opportunities for land ownership and enshrine their participation in the management of their traditional country. They also provide the framework for an ongoing productive and cooperative relationship between the State and the Quandamooka people.

My Government is working towards 80 per cent of North Stradbroke Island becoming national park once all existing mining operations end. On 25 March 2011, the first stage of the new Naree Budjong Djara National Park was declared over 20 per cent of the island. This means that 5240 hectares has already been given the highest possible form of protection.

The agreement of the ILUA will result in the declaration of additional protected areas on North Stradbroke Island, securing the protection of approximately 50 per cent of the island by December 2011.

The Queensland Government's North Stradbroke Island strategy provides for an orderly and planned transition to a future without mining. To assist the transition, an Economic Transition Taskforce with representation from local business, the local community, the Quandamooka People and local and state government interests has been established.

Through the Taskforce the Government is working with the Island community to develop local ownership and leadership to stimulate employment initiatives and economic development projects.

The Taskforce is currently overseeing a work program that investigates the viability of different economic opportunities on the Island. This includes the development of a Regional Economic Development Strategy which will be supported by a number of Industry Action Plans across key sectors including tourism, the education and training sector, indigenous business, and a fourth sector yet to be determined.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-4 in relation to implementation of significant reforms of the Parliamentary Committee system, will the Premier provide some details about how the legislative changes by the Parliament of Queensland (Reform and Modernisation) Amendment Bill 2011 will strengthen and support the role of the Legislative Assembly in scrutinising legislation and executive government?

**ANSWER:**

The *Parliament of Queensland (Reform and Modernisation) Amendment Act 2011* (the Act) implemented the first stage of the government's response to the work undertaken by the Bipartisan Committee System Review Committee in 2010.

The Act provides the legislative framework for the establishment of a system of portfolio committees made up of an equal number of government and non-government members. The Assembly recently established seven such portfolio committees which have been allocated responsibility for reviewing portfolio areas including each Minister and the departments, statutory authorities, government owned corporations or administrative units which report to them.

The role of the portfolio committees is to consider Appropriation Bills as estimates committees; consider Bills and subordinate legislation; and perform their role in relation to public accounts and public works within their portfolio. The portfolio committees will be able to question Ministers and public servants about these matters and their comprehensive powers and responsibilities will ensure that the budget, accounts, capital works, Bills and subordinate legislation for Ministerial portfolio areas will be examined in one committee forum in a coordinated and comprehensive manner.

A key aspect of these reforms is the ability of the portfolio committees when considering a Bill to not only consider the application of fundamental legislative principles contained in the *Legislative Standards Act 1992*, but to also consider the policy intent of the Bill. In undertaking this function, the portfolio committees are able to call for and receive submissions about the Bill; hold public hearings and take evidence from witnesses; engage expert or technical assistance and advice; and seek the opinion of other portfolio committees.

I expect that the new portfolio committees will ensure the highest standards of parliamentary scrutiny of the executive.

**QUESTION:**

With reference to SDS 1-71, will the Premier advise how many applications have been received for NDRRA funding since December last year (listing all projects separately by council)?

**ANSWER:**

To allow all local government areas across the state to commence the recovery and reconstruction process as quickly as possible, the Queensland Reconstruction Authority has provided advance payments to councils.

This is the first time since NDRRA arrangements began that local governments have received such funding up front. Previously, reimbursement of funding was provided following the completion of projects, with local governments receiving reimbursement for costs incurred.

As at 28 June 2011, the Queensland Reconstruction Authority (the Authority) had provided 56 Queensland Local Governments, impacted by recent natural disasters, with more than \$450 million in grant advance funding to ensure reconstruction works are not delayed by liquidity or cash-flow problems.

The size, quality and complexity of submissions vary considerably, from several thousand dollars to tens of millions of dollars. Each submission is assessed on a case by case basis, with some requiring clarification of detail from local governments. As at 7 July 2011, a total of 310 submissions from 37 local authorities had been received by the Authority, as listed in the following table.

I note that over half of these submissions have been received from Brisbane City Council, who I understand had asked each works depot to make individual submissions, with some claims as small as \$462. Many other Councils have bundled their submissions into work packages of several hundred thousand dollars or more, allowing the Authority to process these applications more efficiently. Discussions are occurring with Brisbane City Council to assist in streamlining their application processes.

With reference to SDS 1-71, will the Premier advise how many approvals have been issued for NDRRA funding since December last year (listing all projects separately by council)?

**ANSWER:**

To allow all local government areas across the state to commence the recovery and reconstruction process as quickly as possible, the Queensland Reconstruction Authority has provided advance payments to councils.

This is the first time since NDRRA arrangements began that local governments have received such funding up front. Previously, reimbursement of funding was provided following the completion of projects, with local governments receiving reimbursement for costs incurred.

As at 28 June 2011, the Queensland Reconstruction Authority (the Authority) had provided 56 Queensland Local Governments, impacted by recent natural disasters, with more than \$450 million in grant advance funding to ensure reconstruction works are not delayed by liquidity or cash-flow problems.

The size, quality and complexity of submissions vary considerably, from several thousand dollars to tens of millions of dollars. Each submission is assessed on a case by case basis, with some requiring clarification of detail from local governments. As at 7 July 2011, a total of 310 submissions from local authorities had been received by the Authority and of these a total of 120 had been approved for funding, some two-thirds from Brisbane City Council, while 23 have been assessed and either rejected or withdrawn.

Of the submissions currently under consideration, 13 are back with local governments awaiting further information, and a further 43 submissions were only received in the last two weeks.

With reference to SDS 1-3, will the Premier detail the number of staff allocated to the Premiers Disaster Relief Appeal, listed in table format by date of appointment, pay level and duration of service in days, including whether they were seconded from within the public service or outside appointments?

**ANSWER:**

In addition to my response to Question on Notice No. 484 of 5 April 2011, I confirm that the Premier's Disaster Relief Appeal (the appeal) Secretariat has three full time equivalent staff temporarily seconded from within the public service, allocated to support the appeal's Distribution Committee.

In addition to the Secretariat staff within my department, the Financial Management section of my department has a total of six full time equivalent staff engaged in managing donations to the appeal and receipting donations.

Staff wages are being met through my department's operating budget. Not one cent of the money donated to the appeal is being used to meet administration costs or to pay staff wages.

However, in addition to staff in my department, the assessing and processing over 38 000 claims for assistance from the appeal has involved significant deployment of officers from the Department of Communities, the Department of Environment and Resource Management and the Australian Government (Centrelink).

Staff numbers fluctuate as demand has fluctuated.

As previously advised, at the commencement of Round 1 in late January 2011, a total of 51 staff including 13 Queensland Government employees (Department of Communities 8 employees, Department of Environment and Resource Management 5 employees) and 38 Australian Government (Centrelink) employees were engaged in the assessment and processing of claims.

By mid February 2011, this number had increased to a total of 76 staff, including 20 Queensland Government employees (Department of Communities 12 employees, Department of Environment and Resource Management 8 employees) and 56 Australian Government (Centrelink) employees.

This resourcing was increased in response to the large volume of applications received. At the peak of the Round 1 activity in early March 2011, a total of 415 staff including 135 Queensland Government employees (Department of Communities 127 employees, Department of Environment and Resource Management 8 employees) and 280 Australian Government (Centrelink) employees were engaged in the assessment and processing of claims.

Rounds 2 and 3 have been administered by the Department of Communities and have had up to 200 staff, led by an Assistant Director-General, working seven days a week assessing and case managing structural damage assistance applications.

As of Friday 8 July, 146 staff were allocated to this assessment process.

Numbers of staff involved in assessing claims under current funding rounds will continue to fluctuate as demand dictates.

My Government is committed to paying the appeal funds out quickly to those who need a helping hand to recover from the impact of the floods and Tropical Cyclone Yasi. Sufficient staff numbers have been allocated across Government to ensure that the distribution of funds is not delayed.

**Supplies and Services** includes budgeted costs for:

- Contractors to assist with the establishment of the Authority, Value for Money Framework required by the National Partnership Agreement, preparation of the State, Local and Implementation Plans, reporting systems and processes required to ensure efficient and appropriate distribution of Recovery and Reconstruction monies.
- Travel and vehicle expenses to engage with communities and local governments
- Establishment and ongoing costs in relation to communication and community liaison arrangements and framework including mapping of destruction and reconstruction.
- Information and Communication Technology expenditure for the Authority internally and external requirements to enable reports from Local Government and State Agencies in relation to reconstruction progress across the State.
- Centralised costs such as office rental and utilities.
- Costs in relation to the Authority's governance requirements including the finance and accounting function, internal assurance function, procurement and contracts function and general administration function.

**Depreciation** expense includes the accounting depreciation of the Authority's Non-Current assets capitalised in accordance with Queensland Treasury guidelines.

**Other expenses** includes Queensland Audit Office fees, Authority insurance costs and other minor costs.

The total operating budget for the Authority equates to approximately 1 per cent of the \$6.8B disaster recovery funding. Due to the nature of the recent disaster events, the Authority is required to undertake many tasks that are additional to those normally undertaken by Government during a disaster event.

**ANSWER:**

- (a) The cash surplus from 2010-11 will be directed to Natural Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangements (NDRRA) expenditure in 2011-12.
- (b) As noted on SDS 1-70 the balance of cash at the end of the 2010-11 financial year will represent cash at the beginning of the 2011-12 financial year. The remaining cash surplus for 2011-12 will be directed to NDRRA expenditure in 2012-13.
- (c) The State and Federal Governments have provided \$1.99 billion of grants toward NDRRA projects. The Queensland Reconstruction Authority has provided \$450 million of NDRRA grant advance funding to Local Government Agencies and \$443 million of NDRRA grant advance funding to State Agencies. Both Local and State Agencies are currently undertaking acquittal processes in relation to these advances. The proceeds from the sale of the Abbot Point Coal Terminal have been received into Consolidated Fund and the \$1.8 billion is in the process of being transferred to the Reconstruction Authority this week.

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE TREASURER AND MINISTER FOR STATE DEVELOPMENT AND TRADE (MR FRASER)—

Will the Treasurer explain how the Budget acts to reduce the pressure of electricity prices?

ANSWER:

Alleviating cost of living pressures on Queenslanders, including by reducing household electricity bills, was a key focus of the 2011-12 State Budget.

In particular, Government announced the abolition of the Community Ambulance Cover (CAC) levy to deliver cost of living relief of \$113 per year from 1 July. More than 1.4 million Queensland households and small businesses will directly benefit from the abolition of levy, with ambulance services to remain free for all Queenslanders.

On top of the \$113 direct saving, the Government's \$60 million extension of the ClimateSmart Home Service, including the new 'standby power eliminator', has the potential to reduce electricity bills by a further \$190.

To place further downward pressure on electricity bills, Government directed Ergon Energy and Energex not to recover the additional revenue of \$93.2 million that would have been allowed in 2011-12 under a recent Australian Competition Tribunal decision. This additional revenue would have resulted in higher network costs.

The Government has also taken action in agreement with Energex and Ergon Energy to ensure the costs of repairing the distribution network following the 2011 natural disasters will not be passed onto consumers.

The 2011-12 Budget provides an additional \$7 million per annum to increase the Electricity Rebate and Electricity Life Support Concession Scheme by 6.6% in line with the increases announced by the Queensland Competition Authority. In addition, the Budget provides \$411 million in 2011-12 for the Uniform Price Tariff.

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE TREASURER AND MINISTER FOR STATE DEVELOPMENT AND TRADE (MR FRASER)—

Will the Treasurer outline the measures in Budget Paper No. 4 to assist Queenslanders with the cost of living and how the total budget for concessions in Queensland compares with those in other State Budgets?

ANSWER:

The 2011-12 Budget allocates \$1.385 billion to provide cost of living concessions to improve access to and affordability of a range of services for individuals and families that are most in need.

Budget Paper No. 4 highlights a number of measures to assist Queenslanders. These include:

- A saving of \$113 per year to each of the estimated 1.4 million electricity account holders through the abolition of the Community Ambulance Cover Levy. All Queenslanders will continue to be covered for emergency ambulance services throughout Australia.
- \$7 million per annum to increase the Electricity Rebate and Electricity Life Support Concession Scheme by 6.6% in line with the increase in electricity prices.
- \$60 million over three years to extend the ClimateSmart Home Service from January 2011 to December 2012. It is estimated this service will reduce household electricity bills by up to \$480 per annum to approximately 430,000 households in Queensland.
- \$4.9 million per annum to alleviate the impact of rates and charges levied by local governments for pensioners who own their own home. In 2011-12 the maximum subsidy available will increase by \$20 to \$200 per annum.
- \$2.8 million per annum to lessen the impact of water prices for pensioners connected to the South East Queensland water grid by increasing the subsidy available by \$20 to \$120 per annum.
- \$1.2 million over three years to provide financial counselling services to assist individuals and families in need of assistance with managing their finances.

Appendix B of Budget Paper No. 2 outlines the range of concessions, in the form of discounts, rebates and subsidies provided by the Government to improve access and affordability of services. In 2011-12, the estimated cost of concessions is \$1.385 billion.

Based on an analysis of other States' budget papers, Queensland provides the highest relative level of concessions.

ANSWER:

The abolition of the Community Ambulance Cover Levy (CAC) will not impact on the funding of the Ambulance Service.

Since its inception in 2003, CAC revenue has represented approximately 30% of the annual funding provided to the Ambulance Service. The Government will now fund this amount directly from the Budget and Queenslanders will have access to ambulance services at no direct cost. This will include funding for growth and cost increases.

In the 2011-12 Budget the Government is providing \$575.84 million for ambulance services, an increase of 8% on the Budget for 2010-11. Funding is provided for 50 new ambulance officers, 140 new and replacement vehicles and four new stations.

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE TREASURER AND MINISTER FOR STATE DEVELOPMENT AND TRADE (MR FRASER)—

What measures have been included in Budget Paper No. 4 to stimulate the housing market and how does Queensland compare with other States and Territories?

ANSWER:

Two significant measures included in Budget Paper No. 4 to stimulate the housing market are the National Rental Affordability Scheme and Queensland Building Boost.

\$93.2 million is provided over five years towards the National Rental Affordability Scheme which creates incentives for investors to provide affordable private rental accommodation. By 2014-15, over 11,300 properties will be provided through investors receiving annual incentives over ten years to invest in new affordable private rental dwellings across Queensland.

The Queensland Building Boost is a six month, \$140 million initiative that will provide a \$10,000 grant for a person or corporation building or buying a new home in Queensland valued at less than \$600,000. The Boost is aimed at stimulating housing construction, thereby creating more Queensland building jobs and will also add to the state's existing housing stock.

The Boost builds on the Government's reforms in previous budgets to make housing more affordable for young people. Queensland first home buyers are already exempt from duty on first home purchases up to the value of \$500,000, with the Boost available in addition to the concessions that are already in place and also the \$7,000 First Home Owner Grant.

Taking into account the grants and transfer duty arrangements in each State on a median priced home, first home buyers purchasing a new home are better off in Queensland than in any other State

(a) New South Wales has not yet released its 2011-12 budget. The New South Wales figures are those provided in the 2010-11 Half-Yearly Review, released December 2010.

The key contributors to Queensland's economic growth in 2011-12 are forecast to be business investment and exports. Business investment is forecast to grow 27¾% in 2011-12, largely reflecting a ramp up of construction of LNG projects and further coal mining investment. Exports are forecast to grow 10% in 2011-12, the strongest rate in a decade, reflecting a recovery from natural disasters in the coal, tourism and agriculture sectors.

With reference to Budget Paper No. 2, page 38, will the Treasurer advise both how Queensland's business investment over 2010-11 compared with the forecast in the 2010-11 Budget and with the rest of Australia?

ANSWER:

Growth in business investment in 2010-11 is expected to be stronger than that forecast in last year's State Budget. In the 2010-11 State Budget, business investment in Queensland was forecast to rise 9½% in 2010-11. In the 2011-12 State Budget, Queensland business investment was estimated to rise 13% in 2010-11 compared with 4 ½% for Australia as a whole.

The upgrade for 2010-11 reflects a faster than expected turnaround in engineering construction, with resource related investment driving engineering construction to a new peak in March quarter 2011. This, along with a stronger than expected A\$, has also seen firms invest in machinery and equipment to a greater extent than initially anticipated.

In seasonally adjusted terms, business investment in Queensland was 18.6% higher over the year to March quarter 2011. In the rest of Australia, business investment rose 4.6% over the year to March quarter 2011.

For mainland states, Queensland recorded the strongest annual rise in business investment in March quarter 2011, followed by Western Australia (up 18.2%) and South Australia (up 3.5%).

With reference to Budget Paper No. 2, page 2, which details changes in the State's operating position, what is the change in operating position from 2011-12 to 2014-15 in the 2011-12 Budget compared with at Mid Year Review?

ANSWER:

The forecast operating position in the 2011-12 Budget is for aggregate deficits of \$6.753 billion across the period 2011-12 to 2014-15.

This represents a reduction of more than 30% in the aggregate deficits since the 2010-11 Mid Year Fiscal and Economic Review.

The Government remains on track to deliver an operating surplus in 2015-16.

Taxation per capita in Queensland is significantly lower than the average taxation per capita in the other states and territories. The gap has widened in 2011-12 and is estimated to be \$501 per capita compared with \$315 per capita in 2008-09.

Taxation as a share of gross state product, also confirms that Queensland's taxes are competitive with other states. Tax as a share of GSP has declined from 4.52% in 1999-2000.

Queensland's tax effort, as measured by the Commonwealth Grants Commission, was around 13% below the national average in 2009-10.

The General Government operating statement shows growth in employee related expenses (employee expenses, superannuation interest cost and other superannuation expenses) from 2010-11 estimated actual to 2014-15 of \$3.454 billion.

The average per annum growth in employee expenses from 2010-11 to 2014-15 is 4% which is 1% less than real per capita growth over the same period. This reflects in part, the offsetting impact of the Government's program of 3,500 voluntary separations from non-service delivery areas.

The Government's wages policy of 2.5% applies to all agreements expiring after 31 December 2009. Given the usual length of wage agreements is three years, there are existing agreements on foot that settled under the previous wages framework. Consequently, the forward estimates reflect actual wage increases where they were agreed to under the previous wages policy and reflect 2.5% per annum wage agreements in the years after the expiry of the current agreement.

In addition, the 2011-12 Budget forecasts population growth of 8.25% over the budget and forward estimates period. Accordingly, a portion of the increase in employee expenses represents maintenance of service delivery effort in frontline areas such as policing, health and education.

Table 5.2, page 101 of the 2011-12 Budget Paper No. 2: Budget Strategy and Outlook and Table 5.2, page 91 of the 2010-11 Budget Paper No. 2: Budget Strategy and Outlook provides a breakdown, by year, by department, of the efficiency dividend from 2010-11 to 2014-15 and ongoing.

As outlined in my response to Question on Notice No. 2063 of 2010, efficiency dividends are implemented by reducing the appropriation funding available to each department by the amount of the efficiency target.

As each department is responsible for finding efficiencies sufficient to meet their target, each agency may be asked.

In relation to Treasury, a comprehensive program of expenditure management has been undertaken to achieve savings without impacting on service delivery. For example, in the case of travel expenses this has required use of best value economy fares and cessation of airline club memberships for senior staff (savings to date of \$90,000), rationalisation of accommodation and car parking (\$362,000 savings to date), efficiencies in procurement and payment practices (\$450,000 savings to date), savings in telephony including the use of VOIP phones and cheaper panel rates (\$37,000 savings to date) and a range of savings measures outlined in more detail below.

Additional savings have been achieved in the Office of State Revenue by use of ecommerce through the Revenue Management System and more efficient use of external banking and mail services.

The following provides a more detailed list of Treasury's primary savings measures.

- Whole of Department:
  - reducing domestic air travel (eg through use of web and video conferencing);
  - rationalising accommodation, car parking and reducing associated fringe benefit tax liabilities;
  - tighter controls around expenditure scrutiny and approval within Corporate Services functions, including staffing related costs, asset purchases and general supplies and services costs;
  - savings in advertising and communication services by increasing the uptake of web communication;
  - efficiencies in procurement and payment practices with savings in a wide range of supplies and services expenses including subscriptions, printing services and media monitoring;
  - savings in advertising for job positions and tendering by utilising online advertising and the e-tender website;
  - using the web as the predominant channel for Treasury publications;
  - savings in telephony through the use of Telstra VOIP phones and cheaper panel rates; and
  - implementing workforce management strategies which includes encouraging staff to take their annual leave, encouraging more innovative and less costly staff development activities such as work-based and online training.
- Office of State Revenue specific:
  - utilising the locked-box mail facility available under the Queensland Government banking arrangements for receipt of mail and payments;
  - transitioning of counter services to Queensland Government Service Centres; and
  - continuing streamlining of processes through the Revenue Management System, including shifting taxpayers from commissioner assessment to self assessment.

As indicated on page 119 of Budget Paper No. 2, the increase in the total level of borrowings for 2011-12 of \$9.365 billion reflects (a) purchases of non-financial assets of \$7.180 billion (b) equity injections of \$456 million and (c) an operating cash deficit in 2011-12 of \$961 million.

**Question on Notice No. 1**

**Asked on 28 June 2011**

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE MINISTER FOR FINANCE, NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE ARTS (MS NOLAN)—

With reference to SDS 1-114, will the Minister outline the recent achievements of the Queensland Government in red tape reduction?

ANSWER:

The Queensland Government is committed to maintaining a competitive regulatory environment that supports Queensland business, community and government in driving innovation, productivity and economic growth for the benefit of all Queenslanders. The reform agenda continues to maintain momentum at both state and national levels, and the benefits of this commitment are becoming clear.

For the first time, we have a target of reducing the compliance cost burden to business and the administrative burden to government by \$150 million per year by 30 June 2013 under the Queensland Regulatory Simplification Plan. In 2009-10 alone, \$78 million of regulatory savings were achieved for business and government, largely through the introduction of the Smart Electronic Development Application system. We are the only jurisdiction which publishes all government agency simplification plans in a central location as we are committed to hearing from stakeholders on whether the right reform areas are being targeted.

Also for the first time, we have a best practice regulatory development and review process, the Regulatory Assessment Statement System. The RAS system closes a significant gap in the regulation making process by, for the first time, capturing primary legislation and quasi regulation, instead of just subordinate legislation. Already, this has resulted in eight RASs being done on proposals with significant impacts, six of which were on aspects of proposals that would otherwise not have been captured under the previous system. Over the past year, the Queensland Office for Regulatory Efficiency in Queensland Treasury has helped agencies skill up on regulatory best practice across government, and undertake better impact assessment.

However, it is still early days. The Regulatory Assessment Statement System and agency Regulatory Simplification Plans have only been in place together for around 12 months.

The benefits of the flexibility of this system to business and the community were evident earlier this year. The Government implemented a streamlined Regulatory Assessment Statement process to expedite the work of agencies and reduce the delays and impacts experienced by community and business in response to the floods and Cyclone Yasi.

The Minister for Tourism, Manufacturing and Small Business and I announced on 15 June this year that the Government will establish a Business Commissioner to cut red tape.

The Business Commissioner will give the business sector a direct voice within government and identify areas of reform that will benefit business and the state economy as a whole, with the following roles and responsibilities:

1. Liaise with business through the Queensland Small Business Advisory Council (QSBAC) and established peak bodies on regulation and make recommendations to government for change to the regulatory environment, including reducing time taken by regulators to complete regulatory processes and making regulation simpler for businesses to read, understand and comply with;
2. Coordinate the regulatory simplification actions of government to enhance Queensland's productivity and competitiveness. This will include proactively communicating to business the measures that have been taken by the Government to improve the productivity, enhance business confidence and improve the conditions for business success;
3. Provide a central 'go to' point for business via industry peak bodies, to raise systemic (as opposed to individual business complaints) issues for the Commissioner to address. The Commissioner will alert relevant State agencies of concerns of the business sector that require resolution and make recommendations as to how this should occur. This may include referring matters to State dispute resolution bodies (such as the Queensland Civil and Administrative Tribunal and the Ombudsman (QCAT)) and making recommendations to Government about how to address systemic issues;
4. Advise Government and regulatory agencies about best practice regulation and identify, investigate and report on systemic regulatory issues and solutions.

The position will report to the Minister for Tourism, Manufacturing and Small Business and myself on regulatory issues and the opportunities for positive efficiency and productivity gains in the Queensland business environment.

The establishment of the Commissioner is in response to recommendations made by the Ai Group for ways to reduce the regulatory burden for business in Queensland.

I expect the Commissioner, and the office supporting the Commissioner, will be established and operational in September this year.

Real reform takes time, but the Government is committed to this long term agenda to ensure that the big reform benefits flow through to Queensland businesses and the economy sooner rather than later.

At the national level, Queensland and the other jurisdictions are working to reduce the compliance burden through harmonisation of regulatory regimes. Under the National Partnership Agreement to Deliver a Seamless National Economy, important reforms such as occupational health and safety, Australian business names and the national occupational licensing system will deliver benefits to all Australians.



Treasury oversighted the achievement of a number of business regulation reforms in the last financial year. The Australian Consumer Law is providing benefits to all sectors of the economy and to all consumers and businesses. This reform has delivered a single, national law for fair trading and consumer protection which applies equally in all Australian jurisdictions. Product safety reform compliments the Australian Consumer Law with a national product safety regime, covering safety standards, product bans and withdrawals and enforcement. These reforms together have strengthened consumer protection while providing businesses with more certainty.

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE MINISTER FOR FINANCE, NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE ARTS (MS NOLAN)—

With reference to Budget Paper No. 2, will the Minister provide a breakdown of the dividends expected from government owned corporations and entities and the community service obligation paid to these organisations to deliver services to Queenslanders?

ANSWER:

**Dividends**

Government holds a significant investment in the Government owned corporations (GOC) sector. The primary purpose of the GOCs is to provide services. This year CSO payments to GOCs exceed dividends by more than \$1 billion.

Dividends are paid out of net profits after tax, that is, after all expenses, including operations and maintenance. Through this policy, Government is ensuring that the reliability and security of GOC essential services is not compromised.

GOCs are forecasting to provide dividends of \$783 million in 2011-12. This includes \$586 million from the energy sector, \$163 million from the transport sector and \$34 million from QIC and SunWater.

## Community Service Obligations

Community service obligation (CSO) payments are made to GOCs to undertake non-commercial or community service objectives of Government. They are essential to assist in redressing the social inequity that may otherwise exist in the community in terms of access to essential and other services.

The Government continues to fund Queensland Rail to provide affordable, safe and reliable public transport and regional rail networks; Ergon Energy, to ensure electricity is affordable for all Queenslanders, particularly those in regional areas; and SunWater to assist irrigators.

In 2011-12, the Government has budgeted to pay CSOs to GOCs of \$1.825 billion. This includes \$411 million to Ergon Energy, \$1.407 billion to Queensland Rail and \$6 million to SunWater. CSO payments are expected to increase to \$1.950 billion in 2014-15 which reflects growth in demand for these services and the increasing cost of providing them.

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE MINISTER FOR FINANCE, NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE ARTS (MS NOLAN)—

With reference to Budget Paper No. 3, will the Minister provide a breakdown of the value of the capital works program proposed for each of the government owned corporation sectors?

ANSWER:

The Government owned corporation (GOC) capital works programs enable the Government to ensure the reliability and security of the essential services provided by the GOCs. The GOC capital works expenditure for 2011-12 is estimated to be \$5B across the GOC sector.

GOC capital works are primarily funded by GOCs with a combination of borrowings and internal cash flows. However Government undertakes to provide equity funding and/or dividend reinvestments for major GOC capital works programs, when such programs can be demonstrated to drive value, efficiency and enhancements to the delivery of the essential services our State and its economy depend on.

**ENERGY GOCS**

Capital expenditure of over \$3.5B is budgeted in the energy GOC sector for 2011-12. The primary focus of the energy GOCs' capital works programs is to ensure ongoing reliability and efficiency of Queensland's electricity supply. The capital programs form part of the energy GOCs' commitment to provide a safe, secure and reliable, cost effective electricity delivery.

- ENERGETEX plans capital expenditure of \$1.3B for 2011-12, including \$718M on network programs and \$392M on distribution system upgrades to support significant commercial infrastructure in Brisbane and reinforcement of electricity supply across South East Queensland.
- Ergon Energy plans capital expenditure of \$937M for 2011-12, primarily related to providing a cost effective, safe and reliable electricity supply for domestic and commercial customers, which includes \$667M to reinforce electricity supply.
- Powerlink plans capital expenditure of \$859M for 2011-12, focusing on the establishment of new substations and transmission lines, and maintenance of existing infrastructure in regional Queensland.

- CS Energy plans capital expenditure of \$167M for 2011-12, including \$66M in overhaul work on Callide, \$32M on Swanbank, \$19M on Mica Creek and \$32M on Kogan Creek power stations, and a further \$15M on the construction of the Kogan Creek Solar Boost Project.
- Tarong Energy plans capital expenditure of \$135M for 2011-12, including \$62M on Tarong Coal projects and \$65M on Tarong, Tarong North and Wivenhoe power station maintenance and improvements.<sup>1</sup>
- Stanwell plans capital expenditure of \$120M for 2011-12, including \$53M on upgrades and overhaul work at Stanwell power station, \$14M for upgrades of information systems and \$36M in new gas generation opportunities.

## **TRANSPORT GOCS**

Capital expenditure of over \$1.4B is budgeted in the transport GOC sector for 2011-12. The transport GOCs' capital works programs deliver infrastructure development that support Queensland's growing population and economy.

- Queensland Rail is committed to delivering a transport infrastructure program that supports Queensland's growing population. Queensland Rail plans capital expenditure of \$1.2B in 2011-12, including \$240M on Citytrain track infrastructure and upgrades, and \$260M on acquisition and enhancement of passenger rollingstock.
- Gladstone Ports plans capital expenditure of \$147M in 2011-12 for ongoing expansion at the Port of Gladstone, Port of Bundaberg and Port Alma, including \$65M for construction of a coal stockpile and continuing works at the RG Tanna Coal Terminal.
- Port of Townsville plans capital expenditure of \$87M in 2011-12 for plant acquisition, infrastructure development and port improvements to ports of Townsville and Lucinda, including \$23M for the completion of the \$102M Townsville Marine Precinct project.
- North Queensland Bulk Ports plans capital expenditure of \$34M in 2011-12 for various port development projects, including \$20M for preliminary works for proposed multi-cargo facility at the Port of Abbot Point and \$6M for plant and equipment upgrades at the Port of Mackay.
- Far North Queensland Ports has allocated \$12M in 2011-12 towards new and continuing seaport development in Far North Queensland.

## **SUNWATER**

SunWater plans capital expenditure of \$25M for 2011-12, including \$9M of upgrades to Kinchant dam and Tinaroo Falls dam spillways, as well as refurbishment and enhancement of infrastructure assets.

Note 1: Tarong Energy became a subsidiary of Stanwell on 1 July 2011 as part of the restructure of the Generator GOCs, which also resulted in a number of individual plants being re-allocated between CS Energy and Stanwell.

**Asked on 28 June 2011**

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE MINISTER FOR FINANCE, NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE ARTS (MS NOLAN)—

With reference to SDS 1-130, will the Minister provide an outline of how the Queensland Government's balance sheet will benefit from the Wiggins Island Coal Export project being lead by the private sector?

ANSWER:

The proposed Wiggins Island Coal Export Terminal (the Terminal) will be located at the Port of Gladstone, north of the entrance of the Calliope River and the existing RG Tanna Coal Terminal. The total capacity of the terminal will be approximately 80 mtpa, delivered incrementally. Stage 1 is expected to deliver capacity of up to 30 mtpa with first shipments through the terminal expected in 2014.

The significant demand for export coal supply chain infrastructure has necessitated that Government pursue innovative funding models to deliver capital projects that utilise the balance sheet of large coal companies, rather than the State's balance sheet.

To this end in November 2008, the Government granted preferred developer status for the proposed new Terminal to the Wiggins Island Coal Export Terminal (WICET) Group, a consortium of coal companies. The WICET Group rather than the State will finance and own the proposed Terminal, with Gladstone Ports Corporation Limited as operator.

The benefit of this arrangement to the State is that at a whole-of-Government level it avoids the need to borrow up to a further \$2.5B – the expected cost of Stage 1.

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE MINISTER FOR FINANCE, NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE ARTS (MS NOLAN)—

With reference to Budget Paper No. 2, page 171, will the Minister detail the total subsidy that will be provided to local council water distribution entities in 2011-12?

ANSWER:

The Water Grid Manager will sell bulk water, mostly to the council owned retail-distribution entities, at a loss of almost \$500 million in 2011-12.

The Queensland Competition Authority (QCA) has estimated that in 2011-12, the State's bulk water price will be only 55 per cent of the true cost of bulk water supply as estimated by the Grid Service Charges. The QCA's assessment does not include the additional interest costs incurred by the Water Grid Manager to service the accumulated debt arising due to the 10 year bulk water price path.

The State Government has also decided it will only charge a cost of debt return on 'drought' assets. In 2011-12, the lower return on drought assets represents a \$175 million subsidy. The State Government will not recover this foregone revenue in bulk water prices at any stage in the future.

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE TREASURER AND MINISTER FOR STATE DEVELOPMENT AND TRADE (MR FRASER)—

With reference to Budget Paper No. 2, page 91, regarding Sales of Goods and Services, will the Treasurer provide, on a whole-of-government basis, full details of (a) the total number of fees, charges and levies that are accounted for within the referenced section of the budget and (b) of the items listed in (a), how many have been increased by subordinate legislation in 2010-11 and the forecast number of items that will increase in 2011-12?

ANSWER:

- (a) I refer the member to QON 12 which sets out the information collected by Treasury at a whole of government level. The scope of the question could include such charges as the costs of every type of prescription at the pharmacy at the Royal Brisbane Hospital.
- (b) Subordinate legislation implemented in 2010-11 is a matter of public record.
- (c) With the exception of previously announced increases above CPI (for example, Translink fares), it is government policy that a CPI indexation is applied.

THE COMMITTEE ASKED THE MINISTER FOR FINANCE, NATURAL RESOURCES AND THE ARTS (MS NOLAN)—

With reference to SDS1-113, will the Minister provide details of the advice received from electricity generation GOCs on the impacts of the proposed carbon tax on their operations and the cost of electricity?

ANSWER:

Details of the proposed carbon tax were only announced by the Australian Government on 10 July 2011. Now that details have been announced, Government Owned Corporations (GOCs) will be analysing the impact on their operations and provide detailed advice to shareholding Ministers.

Prior to 10 July 2011, it was not possible to determine definitively the likely impact on Generator GOCs and all other entities, as the final design of the carbon tax in regard to compensation for existing generators, the rate of tax, included activities, tax cuts or other benefits for tax payers, the design of any associated trading scheme, etc are significant in assessing the impact on the GOC Generators (Gencos) and the cost of electricity.

On 1 July 2011, the Queensland Government completed a restructure of the Gencos. Under the revised arrangements, the Government's portfolio of generation assets has been re-organised under a two-Genco model under the management of CS Energy Ltd and Stanwell Corporation Ltd.

The restructure was identified in the Shareholder Review of Queensland Government Owned Corporation Generators (Genco Review) which was announced in November 2010.

The impetus for undertaking the Genco Review, and reform of the sector, included the potential impact on the GOC Generator sector from the Australian Government's proposed carbon reduction measures. The restructure of the Genco sector is about efficiently managing the current generation assets in order to maximise their economic lives and the jobs they support.

The forthcoming 2010-11 Annual Reports for CS Energy Ltd, Stanwell Corporation Ltd and Tarong Energy will include asset impairments due to current electricity market dynamics and the Commonwealth's proposed carbon price legislation and other climate change measures.

Treasury's preliminary estimate of the potential accounting value losses due to the carbon price for coal-fired generators is in the order of \$1.6 billion to \$1.7 billion. It is expected the Gencos will record these losses in their 2010-11 financial statement.

However, as the Gencos own a portfolio of coal and non-coal generation assets, on an entity valuation basis, the value loss for the coal-fired generators is offset, in part, by an improvement in the value of gas and hydro generation assets. Preliminary advice suggests the net economic value loss for the Gencos due to the carbon tax could be around \$800 million to \$900 million.

It should be noted that these are Treasury's preliminary estimates, which are being revised in view of the Commonwealth Government's announcement on 10 July 2011.

The Gencos will be making their own estimates of the accounting and economic value losses due to the carbon tax.

With reference to SDS3-133, will the Minister detail the rate of return and any expected dividends to be received on the SEQ Water Grid assets annually until 2015-16 (reported separately by bulk water entity)?

ANSWER:

The SEQ Water Grid comprises approximately 67 per cent drought assets (new water supply assets including climate resilient assets and interconnecting pipelines) and 33 per cent non-drought assets (assets acquired from local governments).

The Queensland Competition Authority's Draft Report on South East Queensland Grid Service Charges 2011-12 sets out the returns on drought and non-drought assets in the SEQ Water Grid in 2011-12.

In order to minimise the impact of water price rises on South East Queensland households and businesses, the State Government made a decision to charge a cost of debt rate or return (ie. lower than a commercial rate of return) on all of the drought assets.

The rate of return on each drought asset is to equal the actual cost of debt incurred. For 2011-12, the forecast cost of debt for:

- Seqwater drought assets varies by asset:
  - Brisbane Aquifer 6.44 per cent;
  - Bribie Island Aquifer 6.21 per cent;
  - Enoggera WTP 6.38 per cent;
  - Ewen Maddock WTP Upgrades 6.38 per cent;
  - Cedar Grove Weir 6.73 per cent;
  - Bromelton Off-Stream Storage 6.73 per cent;
  - Esk-Wivenhoe Pipeline 6.58 per cent;
  - Coominya Pipeline 6.58 per cent;
  - Hinze Dam Upgrade 6.20 per cent;
  - Wyaralong Dam 6.13 per cent; and
  - Wyaralong WTP 6.06 per cent;
- all of Watersecure's drought assets is 6.52 per cent; and
- Linkwater's drought assets varies by asset:
  - Eastern Pipeline Interconnector 6.62 per cent;
  - Network Integration Pipeline 6.59 per cent;
  - Southern Regional Water Pipeline 6.62 per cent;
  - Northern Pipeline Interconnector (Stage 1) 6.57 per cent; and

- Northern Pipeline Interconnector (Stage 2) 6.09 per cent.

Non-drought assets earn a commercial return in exactly the same way as they did when they were owned by councils. This is set for each entity as follows:

- Seqwater and Watersecure 9.91 per cent; and
- Linkwater assets 9.90 per cent.

The Government does not receive dividends from the bulk water entities.

Further, it is worth noting that even when there cost of debt and commercial return are considered, consumers are still assisted by government's decision to subsidise the bulk cost of water, which is sold to councils for almost a \$500 million loss this year.

ANSWER:

The information in question resides with respective GOCs which are each separate legal entities run by an independent board of directors.

The provision of individual consultant payments cannot be provided without obtaining consent from all parties to the contracts.

The GOCs operate in a competitive market environment and undertake specialised functions as part of their core business. The commercial environment in which they operate necessitates the use of consultants in particular circumstances. As a general practice, the engagement of consultants is reserved for discrete commercial requirements where:

- a GOC does not have access to a consultant's specialist skill set internally and training would be considered impractical to address the requirement; or
- there is a requirement, such as legal or external audit, where a GOC must engage an independent consultant.

The State Procurement Policy has been notified as a public sector policy which applies to GOCs. In accordance with the contract disclosure obligations under the State Procurement Policy, affected agencies including GOCs (to the extent the Corporation is subject to the *Right to Information Act 2009*) will publicly disclose basic details of all awarded contracts (including consultancies) and standing offer arrangements of \$10,000 and over, and additional contract details of contracts (including consultancies) and standing offer arrangements of \$10 million and over.

With reference to SDS 1-3 that indicates that the Backing Indigenous Arts initiative will receive \$13.2M in funding over four years, will the Minister provide details of the results expected from this investment?

ANSWER:

The Queensland Government will invest \$13.2M from 2011–15 to continue the highly successful Backing Indigenous Arts (BIA) initiative and secure and extend the economic and market opportunities unearthed through the first iteration of the BIA from 2007–11.

BIA will continue to develop a sustainable and ethical Indigenous arts industry in Queensland, create pathways for artists and showcase their work on the world stage. It confirms the place of the Cairns Indigenous Art Fair (CIAF) as the major Indigenous cultural event on the national calendar.

This investment will deliver results through 5 programs:

- Indigenous Art Centre (IAC) Network
- Building Skills and Opportunities (BS&O) grants
- Indigenous Performance program
- Cairns Indigenous Art Fair (CIAF)
- Queensland Indigenous Arts Marketing and Export Agency (QIAMEA).

\$5.02M will be invested by the Queensland Government to continue the development of a sustainable IAC Network. This includes \$0.62M for essential Capital Infrastructure upgrades to art centres; and \$4.40M to support the operations of the 13 currently funded art centres in Far North Queensland and the Torres Strait; with modest expansion to include developing centres in other communities and towns.

\$2.7M will be invested over 2011–15 to continue the BS&O Program supporting strategic and diverse projects in areas such as dance, music, theatre, writing, design and visual arts. Projects will extend across Queensland to:

- build the skills of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander artists, artswriters, children and young people
- support artists to create new work and find new markets
- invest in arts enterprises
- use the arts to strengthen culture and communities.

Having already generated \$1.2M in total sales and showcasing 250 Indigenous artists annually since 2009, the Queensland Government will invest a further \$2.5M toward the continuation of the CIAF as Australia's premiere Indigenous art fair and driver of sales and new markets for Queensland Indigenous artists.

Over the next 4 years BIA will expand its focus to capitalise on national and international markets and will position Queensland as a hub for Indigenous arts and culture by developing strong Indigenous performing arts product and touring in theatre, dance and contemporary music.

\$1.78M will be invested to strengthen Indigenous Performance including support for Indigenous festivals, to further touring opportunities and increase access to producing services.

A further \$1.2M will deliver national and international promotion, marketing and export of Indigenous arts through the QIAMEA.

The evaluation of the first 4 years of BIA demonstrated the program's powerful impact with outstanding artistic, social, community and economic outcomes. The next 4 years promise to maintain and build on this strong foundation and extend programs beyond Far North Queensland to other Queensland communities.

With reference to SDS1-53, will the Minister detail what building enhancements will take place at the Queensland Museum South Bank from the \$12.5m allocated in this budget?

ANSWER:

The \$12.5 million being invested by the Queensland Government to upgrade the Queensland Museum South Bank facility represent the most significant upgrade to the facility since it was opened in the mid-1980's.

Enhancements to the facility include:

- a new passenger lift with a capacity for 26 occupants providing access between Levels 0 and 4
- 4 new 800mm wide escalators, including fall protection, to replace the existing 600mm wide escalators which are well beyond their use by date
- construction of new stairs between Levels 0 and 4 providing improved access from Grey Street and improved connectivity between the public gallery spaces
- Level 2 entry and foyer modifications including new ticketing counter with turnstiles and expanded cloak and storeroom
- redeveloped shop on Level 2 with improved whale mall exit points
- café upgrade including expanding the available air-conditioned dining space, a kitchen refurbishment, and additional public toilets
- refurbishment of the Level 5 Indigenous cultural room for the improved storage of sacred remains and a new community viewing room for family members
- Level 1 and Level 4 lighting will be upgraded
- Level 1 Loading Dock modifications including a new dock hoist and replacement of overhead services ducting for improved vehicular access
- minor office accommodation improvements on Levels 5 and 6 to cater for the decanting of staff and provision of more functional and usable office space
- on Level 2 the existing public toilets will be upgraded, and a new parenting room and Persons With Disability toilets will be constructed
- internal way finding signage to complement the facility improvements.

This significant array of facility upgrades will be undertaken during the next 12 months, with the major elements scheduled for completion in March 2012.

(Ms NOLAN)— With reference to SDS 1-40 regarding establishing more Indigenous Knowledge Centres, will the Minister advise how Indigenous Knowledge Centres differ from traditional public libraries and what benefits they produce?

QoN No 8

**ANSWER:**

Since 2002, the State Library of Queensland has partnered with the Torres Strait Island Regional Council and Aboriginal Councils to establish a network of 21 Indigenous Knowledge Centres (IKCs). The centres serve people living in some of the most remote and culturally rich regions of our state.

The State Library's regional office in Cairns coordinates the establishment of IKCs and provides ongoing support, including training for IKC coordinators and council staff, the development of programs and the funding of coordinators for 12 hours per week (on the provision that Councils match this funding).

Councils provide the building, staffing and fund the day to day operations of the IKCs. This is a significant contribution given the often limited infrastructure in remote areas and the competing priorities of local governments without a rate base.

IKCs house the only public computers with internet access in their shires. IKCs provide access to books, magazines, music and films, training in new and innovative digital technologies and exciting cultural programs.

IKCs differ from traditional public libraries in that they play a stronger role in contributing to the emotional and social wellbeing of Indigenous peoples, where pride in culture plays a vital role in people's aspirations and choices. Many people see their local IKC as a cultural hub for story-telling, music and dance.

Owned and operated by councils and employing local people, IKCs evolve under local leadership and community ownership, promoting Indigenous authorship and intergenerational learning to build literacy and life skills and keep culture strong.

IKCs are developing as community keeping places for heritage material. Digital repositories, currently being piloted in Hopevale and Wujal Wujal IKCs, will enable these communities to create virtual museums. They will be controlled by the community, link past, present and future generations and provide safe repositories for documentary heritage. Improved digital literacy also means that communities can access heritage material through online databases of institutions anywhere in the world.

Many remote Indigenous communities do not have access to services such as bookshops, newsagents and theatres. Through the regular services and school holiday programs, IKCs reduce anti-social behaviours that result from boredom and low self esteem.

IKC coordinators develop skills and confidence delivering activities for young people. Many activities employ local artists and link them with professional arts workers to ensure there are opportunities for young people to be gainfully employed and develop skills in arts based and cultural activities. Involvement of local organisations maximises the flow of cultural activities into other aspects of community life such as school, work, recreation, sport, nutrition, language and social history.

In the last six months, through training in IKCs, there has been a significant increase in the use of social media such as Facebook and Skype. This has been particularly useful for the families of children who must go to boarding schools hundreds of kilometres away to further their studies past year 7. It enables these children to keep in contact with family and friends, alleviating homesickness and improving school retention rates.

From children to Elders, everyone can experience the benefits of their IKC as a safe, welcoming space which engages all generations in creative, cultural and educational activities that strengthen and build individual and community capacity.

As the Smart State, the Government recognises that access to knowledge is of utmost importance. The IKCs are great examples of how we are providing all Queenslanders with opportunities for cultural enrichment and lifelong learning.

With reference to SDS 1-48, regarding the number of website users to the QAG website, how has the QAG website been improved to facilitate new and returning users?

ANSWER:

The Gallery sees the internet and in particular, its website, as a key tool in its engagement with visitors and the wider community. For this reason, the Gallery has made improvements to its website and undertaken new digital initiatives which have seen an increase in the number of its website users.

As part of its overarching commitment to visitor accessibility, the Gallery has re-designed the homepage of its website to offer more active and relevant links for users, so that navigation to other pages of the Gallery website is quicker and easier.

With a rising number of people accessing online content from their mobile phones, the Gallery has also introduced a specially designed smartphone version of its website, providing users with a new way to engage with the Gallery's website, as well as increasing its accessibility to a wider range of people.

In addition to these changes, a number of public programs at the Gallery are now being webcast live. Digital initiatives such as these enable the Gallery to engage with audiences who might otherwise miss such opportunities, such as those living in remote and rural areas of Queensland.

For example, the highly successful *GoMA Talks* series, held during the popular *21st Century: Art in the First Decade* exhibition, was webcast live and still remains accessible to the public as a valuable resource. More recently, the Cultural Centre precinct's official opening of *The Torres Strait Islands: A Celebration*, and the Gallery's *Land, Sea & Sky: Contemporary Art of the Torres Strait Islands* exhibition was webcast live.

The Gallery has also developed a purpose-built iPhone app, which was launched late last year. The iPhone app includes extensive web-view content relating to exhibitions, public programs and cinema screenings. The Gallery also incorporates QR codes in key information to the public, as well as in many of its exhibition labels, which allows people to scan the code via their smartphone and then be immediately taken to the Gallery's smartphone website, for more information.

The Gallery is also engaging in social media activity, particularly on Facebook and Twitter, to promote its exhibitions and programs and to provide an interactive interface with its visitors.

With reference to SDS 1-61 regarding visitation numbers, how will QPAC entice an extra 250,000 visitors in 2011-12?

ANSWER:

QPAC's visitation has consistently increased in recent years and is expected to do so into the coming year. In spite of performances lost during flood closure, visitation at the Centre grew almost 4% from 2009-10 to 2010-11 (736 953 to 785 496) and it is anticipated this will reach 1 million in 2011-12.

There are two key factors responsible for the increased visitation:

- An expanded program of events within QPAC's theatres - more performances means more people.
- Greater sophistication in audience analysis and development which results in higher ticket sales.

QPAC's strong curatorial choices coupled with its success in targeted marketing and communications is attracting large audience numbers.

In particular musicals generate very high sold occupancy meaning there is rarely a spare seat in the house. (Sold occupancy is number of tickets sold as a percentage of number of tickets on sale). Last year QPAC presented four major international musicals which accounted for 43% of visitors. (*FAME*, *West Side Story*, *Mamma Mia!* and *WICKED* = 317 849 tickets)

QPAC's program for the coming year has the theatres in almost constant use and features a diversity of product from around Australia and the world.

The program includes four major musicals to be presented in the Lyric Theatre as well as significant international exclusive presentations yet to be announced.

In addition to this, QPAC's program of free and outdoor events will expand next year, including the popular Friday afternoon Green Jam sessions showcasing students from the neighbouring Queensland Conservatorium.

QPAC has developed and implemented an internationally recognised 'First Time Bookers Strategy' aimed at ensuring first time ticket buyers return and has also increased its focus on digital sales and communications strategies.

QPAC can only attract as many seats as it has in the theatres.

With reference to SDS 1–15 regarding arts grants, will the Minister specify (a) which artists have received commissions under this program, (b) the value of such commissions and (c) the criteria that have to be met before a commission is granted?

ANSWER:

SDS 1–15 refers to a wide range of arts grants, some funding individual artists or groups of artists and many funding organisations which then commission artists to create, perform or exhibit work or to deliver services.

In 2010–11 \$697 782 was directly provided to 91 individual grant recipients, across the following programs:

- Artist in Residence
- Backing Indigenous Arts – Building Skills & Opportunities
- Career Development Grants
- Development and Presentation Grants
- Flexible Touring Fund.

Career Development Grants are only open to individuals while the other programs are open to organisations as well as individuals. Not all grants to individuals are commissions for the production of artworks, for example, Career Development Grants are often to attend workshops or markets.

The details of each grant recipient and value are in Attachment 1. The eligibility criteria and criteria for assessment of applications for each program are in Attachment 2.

The majority of Arts Queensland's grant programs do not directly commission artists. They fund the organisations, producers, presenters or curators who then employ or commission artists – such as Major Performing Arts companies, small to medium organisations, local councils and festivals including Brisbane Festival and Queensland Music Festival. Some grant programs are devolved to organisations, such as the Regional Arts Development Fund which is administered by local councils.

Individual artists are not eligible to apply to art+place, Queensland Public Art Fund. Eligibility criteria state only Queensland Government departments and agencies, local government, not-for-profit organisations, and private sector entities can apply. However, individual artists are commissioned by these organisations and some of the art+place allocation to projects is for artist fees.

In 2010–11, 16 Queensland artists received commissions with \$228 238 allocated through six art+place projects and artists have not been finalised for two projects. The details of these commissions are in Attachment 3. The eligibility criteria and criteria for assessment for art+place are in Attachment 4.

With reference to SDS 1-61, will the Minister detail the cost of delivering regional QPAC programming in 2009-10, 2010-11 and 2011-12?

ANSWER:

In 2009–10 and 2010–11 QPAC's regional programming has incorporated 2 main components: touring exhibitions from the QPAC Museum and the regional delivery of KITE Theatre's *Yonder* project.

**2009-10**

In 2009–10 the total cost of these programs was \$184 990 and a total of 13 venues received QPAC's programs.

QPAC Museum exhibitions included:

*Kicking Up Dust*, photographs by Kerry Trapnell of Cape York Indigenous dance performances at the Laura Dance Festival featured at the Cairns Regional Gallery.

*Bobby Dazzler: Celebrating the Helpmann Centenary* celebrating the centenary of the birth of Sir Robert Helpmann through costumes, photographs and artefacts featured at the Albury City Gallery and Museum; The Arts Centre Melbourne; Blackwater Civic Centre; Boonah Cultural Centre; Emerald Art Gallery.

KITE Theatre's *Yonder* conducted workshops and performances in 6 schools, 3 each in the Logan/Albert and Wide Bay Burnett regions as well as a performance at the Moncrieff Theatre, Bundaberg.

**2010-11**

In 2010–11 the total cost of these programs was \$161 374 and a total of 14 venues received QPAC's programs.

QPAC Museum exhibitions travelled to 3 locations: Charters Towers, Colac and Mount Isa.

KITE's *Yonder* project worked with 9 Bundaberg schools and performed at the Moncrieff Theatre and the Bundaberg Regional Art Gallery.

**2011-12**

In 2011–12 QPAC plans to significantly increase its reach in regional Queensland.

KITE Theatre will deliver the 3rd year of the *Yonder* project to schools and communities in the Wide Bay Burnett and Logan/Albert regions. The budget for the regional component of the *Yonder* project in 2011–12 is \$200 000.

In a significant expansion of its regional programming, QPAC will simulcast performances into regional performing arts centres.

Over the next 3 months, QPAC will install infrastructure in regional venues that will enable the live simulcast of major productions taking place in QPAC theatres.

Audiences in a regional centre will experience the performance via satellite in their own town at the same time their Brisbane counterparts are experiencing it at QPAC.

The first stage of this project will be delivered in October 2011 when a performance of the acclaimed Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra is simulcast to 6 regional centres.

There will be a further simulcast of OA productions in 2012.

This means regional Queenslanders won't miss out on stunning performances by national and international companies.

**Question 1**

**With reference to SDS 2-188, what benefits, if any, does the National Prequalification System provide for Queensland building contractors?**

**ANSWER**

- The National Prequalification System for Non-residential Building (NPS) commenced on 1 January 2011 and provides contractors with the eligibility to tender for non-residential building contracts where the construction cost is \$50 million and over. It applies to Queensland Government departments' projects, not Local Governments or Government Owned Corporations projects.
- The NPS is a COAG initiative. Its objectives are to harmonise the prequalification systems of jurisdictions across Australia to avoid duplication of effort by contractors and jurisdictions, and also provides mutual recognition (where possible) of contractor prequalification by jurisdictions.
- Under the NPS, Queensland building contractors need only apply once, by completing an application form and registration for mutual recognition form to receive national prequalification, and be able to take advantage of tender opportunities in other jurisdictions.
- The NPS should make it easier for Queensland building contractors to become eligible to tender for projects in other jurisdictions.
- The processes relating to registration under the NPS do not represent any significant burden to Queensland building contractors wishing to work in other jurisdictions, and do not go much beyond that required under the Queensland

Government's Prequalification (PQC) System (for building contracts under \$50 million).

- The NPS does not compromise any Queensland Government policies, security of payment measures or legal safeguards that presently apply to the Queensland Government's PQC System.

**Question 2**

**With reference to SDS 2-160, how has the Nation Building Economic Stimulus Plan assisted the Queensland construction industry?**

**ANSWER**

The Nation Building – Economic Stimulus Plan has proven to be good news for the Queensland building industry. It has provided and continues to provide jobs for builders, subcontractors and consultants - both big and small.

There are jobs for project managers, architects, engineers, quantity surveyors, building contractors and a range of trades including carpenters, bricklayers and plumbers – as well as apprentices. Not only is this work creating jobs with those companies we are contracting work through, it is also creating jobs in the supply chain.

The Department of Public Works has used multiple procurement strategies for Building the Education Revolution construction projects in Queensland such as design and construction contracts, construction management and traditional contracts.

These multiple procurement strategies have ensured work is shared among large, medium and small business contractors/consultants in each region. Queensland's procurement strategy is designed to provide maximum opportunities for the local building industry to participate.

With these effective procurement strategies in place, the program has engaged approximately 480 contractors and consultants who have been awarded projects across the Building the Education Revolution and the Social Housing Initiative programs.

Works have also been completed at over 1250 schools under the Building the Education Revolution component.

The 4034 dwellings programmed under the Social Housing Initiative will be delivered in a mix of turnkey and 'Not-for-Profit' delivery methods, with not-for-profit organisations delivering \$416 million worth of projects. As at 7 July 2011, 3840 dwellings have commenced on site and 2779 dwellings have been completed.

The Nation Building – Economic Stimulus Plan is due for completion in 2012 and will continue to support the Queensland construction industry through to final completion.

**Question 3**

**With reference to SDS 2-161, what is 13QGOV and how will it help provide Queenslanders with better access to Queensland Government services?**

**ANSWER**

The 13 QGOV (13 74 68) phone number is the single general enquiries number for the Queensland Government. It is available to the Queensland public 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year, and is operated by Smart Service Queensland.

Smart Service Queensland is the front door to the Queensland Government – it provides services to Queenslanders on behalf of all government departments across three channels – counter, telephone and online.

In 2009, as part of the five-year strategy *Towards Q2 through ICT*, this government committed to delivering easy-to-access, customer-centric services and information for Queenslanders. This committed the Government to providing all Queenslanders with a simpler, streamlined way to access government services. Citizens should not have to know which agency does what in order to find out information, undertake transactions or access a service.

Providing a single entry point for phone services was one of the key actions under this strategy.

13QGOV was turned on and started taking calls in mid 2010. It is being advertised to the public as the White Pages directories are rolled out across Queensland. In regional areas, there is also a modest advertising campaign at the same time as the local White Pages come out to raise awareness about this new and streamlined way to find your way into the Queensland Government. As public collateral is renewed, agencies will replace other phone numbers on advertising material with this single access number.



Already Smart Service Queensland is taking over 1500 calls a day on this number and this is expected to double over the next 12 months.

Smart Service Queensland is working with all 13 agencies to move across services and public enquiries to this single entry point. Already we have seen a reduction of over 20 per cent in the numbers advertised in the White Pages – the goal by the end of 2012 is to reduce this to 13QGOV, with less than 20 other specialist numbers, thereby reducing the confusion of the more than 3000 numbers we had in 2009.

To support the new number, Smart Service Queensland has introduced a 'concierge service', which aims to quickly and seamlessly get the caller to the person who can resolve their enquiry. The concierge agent who answers the phone will put the caller through to an agent with the detailed knowledge to answer the enquiry or conduct the transaction, or if it is a specialist agency issue, put the caller through to the right person in the right agency to assist them.

In summary, the implementation of this number is designed to foster and develop a customer-focused approach to government service delivery where customers do not need to understand how government is structured. For the customer, this will provide anywhere, anytime access to the services they require from government, meeting their growing expectations for convenience.

Specific benefits for Queenslanders are:

- Increased accessibility and convenience in using the phone channel to contact government departments through a single whole-of-Government 24/7 number for a larger range of services
- Increased customer satisfaction, as 13 QGOV will also operate as a referral point transferring callers to a key service or agency service areas – getting people to the right contact without a 'run-around'
- Reduced confusion for customers, specifically in cases where customers are unaware of the detailed structure and machinery-of-Government changes

- Consistent, single state-wide access number to government for specific information and services and ability to respond to multiple enquiries across multiple topics in one call
- Enhances the image of 'One Government' from a customer-centric perspective providing seamless delivery of government services regardless of which agency owns the content
- Progressive demonstration of service improvements for the Government, exhibiting public value for money
- Building the confidence of the public in the important services delivered right across the public sector.

Smart Service Queensland's target is to answer the phone within 20 seconds 80 per cent of the time. This is a worldwide standard to ensure we are offering an accessible and valued service.

In recent independent customer satisfaction surveys, Smart Service Queensland's phone channel received a rating of 90 per cent met or exceeded customer expectations. In 2010, a national research consulting group, Customer Service Benchmarking Australia, conducted a mystery shopper survey on services provided by Smart Service Queensland and four other similar customer service providers (Canberra Connect, Service South Australia, Service Tasmania and the Brisbane City Council).

The survey results showed that mystery shoppers rated Smart Service Queensland's phone services better than its interstate counterparts and equal-best with the Brisbane City Council.

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**Question 4**

With reference to SDS 2-204 and 2-226, and to the Auditor-General's two significant audit reports tabled in late June 2011 which included activities associated with ICT business areas and the Shared Service Agency of your department, will the Minister provide information on the action being taken by the department to address the issues reported by the Auditor-General?

**ANSWER**

The Auditor-General of Queensland Report to Parliament No. 4 for 2011 concluded that the department, through CITEC, could improve performance in the following areas:

- IT program management
- Online payment security management
- Computing server operating systems security management
- Shared services IT disaster recovery planning

The Department of Public Works' management responses to the Auditor-General of Queensland Report to Parliament No. 4 identified the following actions:

IT program management

The Department of Public Works is currently reviewing options for assigning sponsoring group responsibilities for whole-of-Government ICT programs, such as the ICT Consolidation (ICTC) Program and the Identity, Directory, and Email Services (IDES) Program.

In relation to the ICTC Program, CITEC is continuing to work with agencies on progressing their migration activities.

In relation to the IDES Program, CITEC is undertaking further consultation with agencies to reach the original forecast total of 81,000 users.

#### Online payment security management

CITEC, in conjunction with Smart Service Queensland, will review all audit findings to ensure that continuing systems have a detailed security assessment in accordance with the audit recommendations for the payment systems base on the current and projected threat environment.

CITEC will review the risks relating to the current level of logging of access to the servers processing financial payments, making recommendations and implementing recommendations where appropriate.

#### Computing server operating systems security management

The Department of Public Works will continue to review and monitor the administration of server operating systems and server security controls.

#### Shared services IT disaster recovery planning

By December 2011, the Department will have developed a Business Continuity Management Framework, which will include the requirement for service level agreements to clearly articulate metrics and testing requirements for disaster recovery. This will clarify the general layered structure of the shared service environment, agency interdependencies and associated roles and responsibilities.

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**Question 5**

What is your department doing to address the potential for sham contracting?

**ANSWER**

The building industry unions have alleged sham contracting exists on Queensland Government building projects including the Gold Coast University Hospital project. To date, no evidence of ‘sham contracting’ has been found on this project.

The Queensland Government does not support unlawful sham arrangements, and should any such arrangements be found to exist on a Queensland Government building project then appropriate action will be taken.

*The Queensland Code of Practice for the Building and Construction Industry provides that arrangements and practices designed to avoid awards, registered agreements and/or legislative obligations are not permitted, including inappropriately treating a genuine employee as an independent contractor, and inappropriate application of taxation arrangements.*

My department’s contracts contain provisions that apply these principles and are designed to minimise the incidence of these types of arrangements.

My department will continue to monitor and enforce these provisions on projects it manages.

The Government will await the outcome and recommendations of a range of reviews and audits currently underway in relation to alleged sham contracting and will consider any recommendations that may be made arising from those reviews, particularly where they support the provisions of the Queensland Code of Practice.

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**Question 6**

**With reference to SDS 2-204, will the Minister advise the committee on work that the department is undertaking to develop capability in the Government’s ICT workforce?**

**ANSWER**

An appropriately skilled ICT workforce is critical to successful project delivery and the effective provision of government services.

There is an increasing challenge for all agencies across the Queensland Government (and in other jurisdictions) to foresee and respond to changes in demand for key skill sets in ICT.

The Public Sector ICT Development Office within my department coordinates the ICT Workforce Capability Program, which supports Queensland public sector agencies to build and align their current and future ICT workforce capability to meet service delivery needs.

The ICT Career Graduate Program, a cross-government initiative, provides an attractive pathway for quality ICT graduates to enter the Queensland Public Service along with structured support and professional development. Since the creation of the program, 165 graduates have been recruited and have participated in this developmental program.

The ICT Capability Program for In-Demand Roles provides whole-of-Government targeted capability development for critical ICT roles. This program focuses on building capability and increasing the retention of existing government staff with critical ICT skills. In 2010 and 2011, these in-demand roles were identified as project managers and business analysts. Across these two years, a total of 96 ICT employees have benefited from the program, with support from their supervisors to apply their learnings in their workplaces.

The ICT Skills Framework provides a consistent language and approach to ICT skills development and continuous capability improvement for ICT employees of all agencies.

The ICT Workforce Planning Methodology enables Queensland public sector agencies to make proactive decisions and identify key strategies to deliver on their current and future ICT workforce needs.

Collectively the initiatives of the ICT Workforce Capability Program are making inroads to this industry's long-term attraction and retention challenges. The Public Sector ICT Development Office will build on these strategies and continue its collaboration with the industry and education sectors to address labour market wide ICT skills issues.

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**Question 7**

With reference to SDS 2-160, what are the benefits of your department's whole-of-Government Standing Offer Arrangements?

**ANSWER**

The Queensland Government Chief Procurement Office currently manages 25 whole-of-Government arrangements. The whole-of-Government Standing Offer arrangements provide improved value for money- including estimated savings of \$62 Million in 2010-2011 and actual savings of \$102.5 Million over the previous two years.

These arrangements also provide reduced risk for the Government through the use of a consistent contractual framework and reduced tendering and contract management costs by reducing duplication of arrangements in common spend categories.

I am pleased to advise that these arrangements increase identification and use of sustainable products and improved visibility of Government spend through centralised information management and uniform vendor reporting requirements.

The costs for suppliers of doing business with the Government is reduced due to greater consistency in terms and conditions and dealing with one contract manager rather than many.

Stronger management of vendor performance has also been implemented.



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**Question 8**

**With reference to SDS 2-180, what arrangements has the department, as the management authority for the Asbestos Management Control Policy for Government Buildings, put in place to administer asbestos data in government owned buildings from a whole-of-government perspective?**

**ANSWER**

My department, as the management authority for asbestos containing material in government buildings, developed the *Asbestos Management and Control Policy for Government Buildings* (the Policy) in 2006.

The Policy has a long term objective for all government controlled buildings to be free of asbestos containing material (ACM).

Until this objective is achieved, the Policy adopts a risk based management approach with high-risk ACM being removed based on its assessed level of risk and low-risk ACM managed in-situ with removal planned in conjunction with building renovations, refurbishments, demolitions and maintenance programs, wherever feasible.

The Policy sets out the roles and responsibilities of the Department of Public Works and government departments that manage government controlled buildings, including workplaces and domestic premises and in particular managing registers of data.

Under the Policy, the department is responsible for maintaining a whole-of-Government central asbestos register.

Government departments have the responsibility for the *in situ* management and removal of ACM in their buildings. Departments also have a responsibility for the provision of asbestos data to the central asbestos register.

My department, as the Queensland Government management authority, has established a number of measures to administer asbestos data in government owned buildings including:

- The Built Environment Materials Information Register (BEMIR) system, which contains the central asbestos register.
- A dedicated website available to all departments (via GovNet), which provides access to a web-enabled whole-of-Government central asbestos register.
- A comprehensive suite of guidance information that complements the whole-of-Government Policy to assist departments in the accurate identification, collection and management of asbestos data relating to buildings they control.
- A Work Area Access Permit process incorporated in the BEMIR system to assist departments to both control work in their facilities and to provide a means of updating information in the register.
- A suite of reports to assist in the management and review of asbestos data in the central asbestos register.
- A new program, eBEMIR, that will enable the electronic collection and uploading of data into the BEMIR to reduce the potential for data entry errors and improve data quality.

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**Question 9**

**With reference to SDS 2-154, how is the State Government reducing its environmental footprint through green buildings and greener fleet management?**

**ANSWER**

**Greener Fleet Management**

In terms of vehicles, the QFleet ClimateSmart Policy for the Queensland Government motor vehicle fleet has been implemented to minimise the greenhouse emissions of the Government's vehicle fleet.

The Policy is derived from the QFleet *ClimateSmart Action Plan* 2007-2010, approved by Executive Government in December 2007.

The Policy was designed to achieve carbon dioxide emission reduction targets of 15% by the end of 2010 and 25% by the end of 2012, compared to a 30 June 2007 baseline.

The 2010 target was achieved ahead of schedule, reaching 15% in July 2009.

As at 31 May 2011, reductions have reached 27.5%, exceeding the 2012 target of 25%.

QFleet has now developed Phase II of the Action Plan, to build upon the success of the original Policy and establish a new emissions reduction target for 2012 of 30%.

QFleet is also conducting an Electric Vehicle Evaluation Program.

On 25 August 2010, QFleet took delivery of the Queensland Government's first electric vehicle - or EV - passenger car, a Mitsubishi i-MiEV. That vehicle was one of only a small initial

shipment to Australia and is now on long-term lease to the Department of Environment and Resource Management (DERM), and plays a key role in the public promotion of DERM's *Electric Vehicle Roadmap for Queensland*.

Another two i-MiEVs joined the QFleet fleet in January 2011 and are being deployed to various agencies as part of QFleet's EV Evaluation Program, in order to assess the potential for wider application of EVs in the fleet. The vehicles are currently with Queensland Health and SDS (Department of Public Works).

QFleet's EV Evaluation Program is investigating the fit-for-purpose application and greenhouse gas abatement potential of EVs in the QFleet fleet. Such evaluation is very important because while EVs have the potential to play a role in QFleet's fleet sustainability initiatives, there is a need to ensure that operational effectiveness and service delivery are not compromised.

QFleet is in discussion with major manufacturers regarding their plans for the release of other EVs in the Australian and Queensland markets.

### **Green Buildings**

The Department of Public Works has a strong environmental focus when delivering services to the community, and is committed to protecting and preserving a sustainable environment. The department actively integrates environmental sustainability into its wide and diverse range of service delivery functions.

The department plays a key role contributing to the Queensland Government's *Towards Q2: Tomorrow's Queensland* vision of a 'green' Queensland - *protecting our lifestyle and environment*.

The department plays a lead agency role in driving a strong environmental agenda in relation to the design, construction and operation of government buildings.

With regard to government buildings, the department has in place a number of policies and initiatives to promote and encourage environmental sustainability within new and existing government buildings, both within the department's own building portfolio, as well as in the buildings of other departments and government agencies.

The department administers a number of key whole-of-Government policies and/or strategies including:

- the *Strategic Energy Efficiency Policy for Queensland Government Buildings* which promotes energy conservation and establishes energy reduction targets for departments of 5% by 2010 and 20% by 2015. As a result, annual energy consumption across the government estate has remained relatively steady over the last three years, despite the growth in the number of government buildings needed to meet increased demands for government services.
- the *Carbon Reduction Strategy for Government Office Buildings* which is intended to make government office buildings 'carbon-neutral' by 2020. This will be achieved largely through increased building energy efficiency. An overall permanent energy saving of 16% have been achieved for the department's office building portfolio so far, with savings in retrofitted major higher energy-consuming buildings averaging 21%. Energy and emission reduction strategies deployed include: using Energy Performance Contracts, retrofitting buildings with energy-efficient technologies, improvements in green purchasing and building maintenance programs.
- the *Recycling Policy for Buildings and Civil Infrastructure* which promotes the recycling and reuse of surplus construction materials from government construction and demolition projects. The Policy aims to promote sustainability in the built environment through the improved utilisation of resources and reduced pressure on landfill waste sites. As an example, the department's own Kangaroo Point TAFE demolition project (now known as Kangaroo Point Park) achieved recycling rates of 100 per cent for metal, 95 per cent for both brick and clean concrete and 80 per cent for builder's waste.

The department also has a number of internal departmental sustainability directives for application by its different business areas undertaking a wide range of building-related activities including planning, design, project management, construction maintenance and facilities management. Some of the key policies are:

- the *Sustainable Timber Procurement Policy* which promotes the procurement of timber from sustainable sources for building

projects controlled by department. It seeks to do this by sourcing timber through chain of custody certification under an internationally recognised certification scheme. There are numerous environmental, economic and social reasons for adopting a sustainable timber procurement policy. These include combating illegal logging and deforestation, sequestering carbon, providing a competitive advantage to local industry, and fostering growth in regional communities.

- the *Vegetation Management Policy* which promotes the protection of plants or groups of plants of value in terms of providing a habitat for native fauna, cultural heritage or local history, visual amenity, provision of shade, or minimising the visual impact of the built environment. The policy requires the assessment of the vegetation on a planned development site so that measures can be taken early in the planning stage of the proposed works to ensure the protection of significant plants or groups of plants where at all possible.

Within its own building portfolio, the department has striven to reduce energy usage and greenhouse gas emissions; reduce reliance on mains supplied water; and reduce the amount of waste sent to landfill. The department has in place its *Sustainable Office Buildings Rating Policy* which commits to ensuring that new and refurbished government office buildings adopt 'best-practice' environmental sustainability designs, including the appropriate Green Star™ and NABERS (National Australian Built Environment Rating System) rating schemes.

As an example, the department has recently constructed three six-star (out of six) Green Star buildings that support agency service delivery in an environmentally sustainable way. The William McCormack Place (Stage 2) in Cairns, the Dandiiri Contact Centre at Zillmere and the new Mike Ahern Centre at Maroochydore were all designed to provide the optimum level of sustainability in government office buildings. A six-star (out of six) Green Star rating for office design equates to 'world leadership'.

As part of the Government's commitment to solar energy, photovoltaic panel energy collection systems have been installed on these three new buildings, and also on Government office buildings located at Mareeba and on Thursday Island. The use of these solar photovoltaic panels will reduce energy demand from

the electricity grid and the level of associated greenhouse gas emissions, as well as reducing the cost for electricity consumed.

The department is also delivering an \$8 million program (funded by the Queensland Climate Change Fund) over four years (2010-2014) towards improving the energy-efficiency and reduce emissions of government buildings such as schools, police stations and hospitals.

Through its Project Services business unit, the department has established an educational framework that promotes 'ecological sustainable development' principles and practices to departmental staff including building planners, designers, supervisors, operators and maintainers. Training has also been provided to planning and design staff within a number of client departments.

The department provides a range of strategic best-practice advisory material for departments, promoting environmental sustainability for government buildings in their Capital Works programs.

The department, as lead agency for Queensland Government Office Accommodation, has also played a key role in a collaborative arrangement between the Government Property Group (under the Australasian Procurement and Construction Council) and the National Framework for Energy Efficiency for the development of a National Green Lease Policy and Framework. This project involved developing a nationally consistent approach for government to lease office premises with environmentally sustainable development credentials from the private sector. Targeting leased premises over 2,000 square metres, the aim of the policy is to develop ways in which both lessors and lessees can work together to harness energy reduction, waste management and water management strategies. The anticipated benefits attributable to Green leasing under the policy is estimated at more than \$450 million over ten years, nationally.

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**Question 10**

**With reference to SDS 2-180, will the Minister advise the committee how the government, through its apprentice and trainee programs, is creating the skilled workforce Queensland needs for the future?**

**ANSWER**

QBuild is one of the Queensland Government's largest employers of building trade apprentices.

The primary objective of QBuild's apprentice training program is to provide employment and training opportunities for young Queenslanders, particularly those in regional areas who have limited local employment and training prospects.

The QBuild apprentice training program is a significant contributor to the Government's priority for the Towards Q2 and the Queensland Skills Plan through:

- contributing to improved employment opportunities for economically disadvantaged Queenslanders
- contributing to enhancing the skills capabilities of Queenslanders within the building and construction industry
- contributing to supporting skilled migrant participation in the labour force
- improving employment and training outcomes for Indigenous Queenslanders with a focus on increasing labour force participation, reducing unemployment, increasing the attainment of trades and higher level skills and qualifications.

QBuild achieves these goals through the development of mentoring and support programs for apprentices and trainees and ensuring targets for disadvantaged Queenslanders are met.

Indigenous people and women are a vital part of the annual intake of apprentice and trainees.



QBuild actively participates with various stakeholders including the Department of Communities, Office of Women, Construction Skills Queensland, Construction Training Queensland and registered training organisations to develop networking partnerships that will provide QBuild apprentices with high quality training and support programs.

To support regional employment, QBuild has identified that a target percentage of 65% of all apprentices employed as part of the annual intake will be employed outside of the Brisbane metropolitan area.

The QBuild 2011 apprentice intake achieved 77% of the 100 positions on offer being employed outside of the Brisbane metropolitan area.

Since 1998, 1,439 apprentices and trainees in 15 different trade categories have been employed.

*This figure includes:*

- 235 Indigenous apprentices and trainees
- 152 school-based apprentices
- 65 construction worker trainees
- 59 female apprentices and trainees
- 28 horticulture apprentices and trainees
- 16 apprentices and trainees identified as having a disability.

Annually, QBuild offers full-time and school-based (part-time) Business Administration Traineeships. The objective of the traineeship program is to give trainees the opportunity to gain work experience and practical skills within a real work environment, while receiving formal training at TAFE or similar accredited institution and complete a nationally accredited qualification in Business Administration.

The combination of these two experiences will equip individuals to be strong competitors in the open job market – both for government and private industry. Since 1998, QBuild has employed 348 Business Administration trainees over 13 regions. This includes full-time and school-based traineeship positions.

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**Question 11**

**With reference to SDS 2-165 regarding ICT service, will the Minister advise the total number of ICT systems currently operated by the government including the last update for each system and any systems which have one or no current authorised operators?**

**ANSWER**

This information can only be sourced directly from each department on a case by case basis. As such should you require further information on ICT systems operation, it is suggested that you direct the request to the relevant Minister. I have provided the information for the Department of Public Works only as below.

An ICT system refers to an “application”, which relates to particular business processes (for example, SAP which would typically be provided only for finance, asset or procurement staff); whereas a Technology is involved with either essential infrastructure or general productivity (such as systems management software or standard issue tools like Microsoft Office) which would typically be provided to all staff.

1. Total number of ICT systems currently operated by the Department of Public Works is 513.
2. The last update for each system cannot be provided as it would take considerable manual effort to generate the information. If you have a specific question about a specific system, then I will provide the information.
3. The Department is actively pursuing an applications rationalisation process which has identified 296 ICT systems in the Department of Public Works that have currently been identified for decommissioning – as such it is believed that those 296 systems have no current authorised operators.

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**Question 12**

**With reference to SDS 2-165 regarding procurement services, will the Minister advise the number of procurement results (valued at \$10m and over) which were not disclosed in 2010-11, including the name of project, value, compliance with the procurement policy and reasons for non-disclosure?**

**ANSWER**

All arrangements managed by the Queensland Government Chief Procurement office (valued at \$10 million and over) for which the Queensland Government was principal were disclosed.

This excludes the new card fuel arrangement which is a collaborative, multi-jurisdiction arrangement with the NSW and ACT governments and was disclosed by the NSW government as principal of the contract on its E-tender website.

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**Question 13**

**With reference to the Capital Statement, page 96, will the Minister provide a list of planned works for cyclone shelters, including the location, estimated completion date, and cost of each shelter planned under the initial \$30m spend, as well as the number of facilities currently used as cyclone shelters in each location?**

**ANSWER**

On 9 May 2011, the Premier announced that another ten shelters will be built with a gift of \$30 million from the Emirate of Abu Dhabi, matched equally by funding of \$30 million by the Queensland Government.

The following cyclone shelters locations have been selected:

- Bowen State High School (Richmond Road), Bowen
- Edmonton Leisure Centre (Walker Road), Edmonton
- Ingham State High School (Marina Parade), Ingham
- New Eimeo State High School, (Rosewood Drive, Rural View) Mackay
- Port Douglas State School (4 Endeavour Street), Port Douglas
- Proserpine State High School/Proserpine State School (Ruge/Sterry Streets) Proserpine
- Heatley Secondary College (Fulham Road), Townsville
- Tully State School (Bryant Street), Tully
- Hibberd Drive, Rocky Point, Weipa
- Yeppoon State High School (Rawlings & Tabone Street), Yeppoon.

Queensland already has four existing cyclone shelters at the Innisfail State High School, Redlynch State College in Cairns and Kowanyama and Cooktown.

The ten new shelters to be built in North Queensland will accommodate over 500 people each and are anticipated to be

completed by November 2012 prior to the start of that year's storm season.

The department will design and build these new cyclone shelters in line with the Design Guidelines for Queensland Public Cyclone Shelters as part of the state-wide reconstruction activities.

The department is currently in the very early stages of project design. At this stage, it is anticipated that each project will cost between \$5 million and \$6 million, except at Weipa which will be considerably higher due to its remoteness.

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**Question 14**

**With reference to SDS 2 -227 regarding the transition of payroll to Health, will the Minister provide the total expenditure to date of the Health Payroll system and stabilisation including separate figures for expenditure on staff and consultants, and the total number of new staff appointed in 2010-11 to the project?**

**ANSWER**

- The Queensland Health Human Resource rostering and payroll technology solution went live on 14 March 2010 with the first pay day being 23 March 2010.
- The Queensland Health Human Resource rostering and payroll technology solution is the most complex payroll solution in the Queensland Government and one of the largest and most complex in Australia.
- The Department of Public Works is working collaboratively with Queensland Health to improve the rostering and payroll technology solution and to address Queensland Health’s changing business requirements and priorities.
- Since 1 April 2010, the Department of Public Works has invoiced Queensland Health for \$45.6 million for the Queensland Health Human Resource solution.
- This amount includes \$11.1 million for public servants and \$10.2 million for contractors.
- In 2010/11 the charges to Queensland Health included an additional 12 public servants and 23 contractors.

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**Question 15**

**With reference to SDS 2-191, 2-208 and 2-229 and outsourced project activity (reported separately), for CITEC, Shared Services and Project Services will the Minister advise (a) how many projects undertaken by each agency required the engagement of external contractors/consultants, (b) how many external contractors/consultants were engaged by each agency for each government project and (c) what was the cost to each project for the engagement of external contractors/consultants?**

**ANSWER**

CITEC undertook two projects that required the engagement of external contractors. 27 and 12 were the number of contractors engaged for each of these projects and seven contractors were engaged on the project jointly with the expenditure costing \$3,674,702, \$2,056,143 and \$994,460 respectively.

Project Services undertook two<sup>1</sup> projects that required the engagement of one external contractor on each project at a cost of \$56,216 and \$145,267 respectively.

The Shared Service Agency undertook two projects that required the engagement of five external contractors, four contractors on one and one contractor for the other. Each project cost \$143,589 and \$20,774 respectively.

CorpTech undertook five projects that required a total of 21 external contractors. A number of these contractors worked across multiple projects at a cost of \$63,995, \$81,740, \$1,044,610, \$1,493,162 and \$29,285 respectively.

<sup>1</sup>Project Services engages private sector building consultants such as architects, engineers, quantity surveyors and building contractors on behalf of other agencies for their projects. Should information be required on a specific project and/or contractor/consultant, it is recommended the question be referred to the relevant Minister.

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**Question 16**

**With reference to SDS 2-227, will the Minister advise the costs incurred in 2010-11 and estimated in 2011-12, in itemised format, of the transition of payroll functions to Queensland Health and the Department of Education and Training?**

**ANSWER**

- The PricewaterhouseCoopers (PwC) review of Shared Services recommended that the Department of Education and Training and Queensland Health assume responsibility for the management of their own HR/payroll business applications.
- As lead agency for the implementation of the PwC recommendations, the Department of Public Works established two projects to progress the transitions.

**Department of Education and Training transition**

- The transition of the education payroll function from the Department of Public Works to the Department of Education and Training was completed on 1 July 2011.
- The Department of Public Works incurred project costs of \$96 536 in 2010-11 relating to the Department of Education and Training transition project.
- In addition to project costs, there will be additional ongoing costs of disaggregation for the Education payroll:
  - 2010-11: Nil
  - 2011-12: \$176 000
- The transition of the training payroll function, used by TAFE institutes, from the Department of Public Works to the Department of Education and Training is subject to further planning.



## **Queensland Health transition**

- The transition of the payroll function from the Department of Public Works to Queensland Health is in the planning stage.
- In 2010-11, the Department of Public Works has incurred costs of \$147 018 in relation to the Queensland Health transition project.
- The Department of Public Works is working with Queensland Health to determine transition dates for both the Finance and HR/payroll solutions.

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**Question 17**

**With reference to SDS 2-183 and QBuild Workplace Health and Safety, will the Minister report by type, how the 1,632 working days were lost, the number of days lost for each category or type and the reason for the increase in days lost of 173 in 12 months?**

**ANSWER**

As at 31 May 2011 a total of 1,558 working days were lost.

The estimated number of 1,632 working days lost for the full year 2010-11, as referenced in the 2011-12 SDS is based on historical trends, year to date figures and on past years' performance.

While QBuild will record an increase in working days lost as compared to 2010-11, the average result across the last two financial years represents an approximate 20% improvement upon the 2008/09 result.

It is noted that working days lost should be considered within the context of the actual number of lost time injuries. As at the end of May 2011, the number of lost time injuries was tracking lower than the result achieved in 2009/10.

The increase from the 2010-11 estimated working days lost target is a result of a limited number of individual injury absences.

Of the actual 1,558 working days lost, there are 33 individual cases, which total over 930 working days lost, with some extending over a three to four month absence due to the nature of the injury, the surgery required and post operation recuperation and rehabilitation.

The vast majority of working days lost relate to musculoskeletal injuries. This type of injury is consistent with the industry in which QBuild operates.

Several other factors have contributed to the increase in working days lost in 2010-11 and include:

- The nature of the work performed by QBuild's workforce which is predominantly physical/manual tasks with potential sprains, strains and lacerations
- A higher workforce establishment to meet operational demands in the February to April 2011 period to deliver flood and cyclone disaster recovery activities leading to an increase in injuries and working days lost.

However, the department is of the view that any injury to a QBuild worker is unacceptable. Therefore, QBuild will continue to implement a range of strategies to improve worker safety and to support the rehabilitation and return to work of injured workers.

- Estimated Actual 2010-11 Expenditure: \$2 369 000
- This was a Department of Education and Training led project, with the Department of Public Works providing partial funding from the Corporate Solutions Program.

**RecruitASP Upgrade Project**

- Budgeted 2010-11 Expenditure: \$128 000
- Estimated Actual 2010-11 Expenditure: \$128 000
- The project upgraded the Queensland Government's Smart Job and Careers recruitment website to the most current version of the vendor supplied software.

Budgeted expenditure for 2011-12 of \$244 000 relates to a planned program of work to upgrade the underlying technical infrastructure supporting shared services.

The Department of Public Works anticipates further capital budgeted expenditure will be allocated following consideration of the Corporate Solutions Program of Work 2011 through 2013 by Executive Government.

MR EMERSON asked the Minister for Finance, Natural Resources and The Arts (MS NOLAN) -

QUESTION:

I turn to the regional touring arts program, arTour. Its audience numbers seem to have fallen quite significantly compared to the program it replaced. Can you explain to me why that has happened? Given the fact that we have seen audience numbers fall, does that indicate, for whatever reason, that the program is not servicing regional communities?

ANSWER:

No.

The regional arts touring model changed at the end of 2009.

Previously, the Queensland Arts Council was provided \$1.9 million in Queensland Government funding to deliver arts touring services to regional Queensland. As I said at the Estimates hearing, the Arts Council determined programming and location. There were 30,229 attendances in 2009.

Under the new model \$1.9 million is provided for regional touring. Under the arTour model a menu of touring performances is developed and regional communities select their productions.

In this new, more competitive market, tours subsidised by government funding through arTour are more in tune with what Queenslanders want.

The arTour model did not commence operations until July 2010 and in its first six months 28,554 people attended arTour performances.

Given that arTour entertained a comparable number of Queenslanders in its first six months as the Arts Council entertained in the last twelve months of the old model, the merit of the new model is clear.

**Question 1**

**With reference to SDS 2-165 regarding ICT service, will the Minister advise the total number of ICT systems currently operated by the government including the last update for each system and any systems which have one or no current authorised operators?**

**ANSWER**

This information can only be sourced directly from each department on a case by case basis. As such should you require further information on ICT systems operation, it is suggested that you direct the request to the relevant Minister. I have provided the information for the Department of Public Works only as below.

1. Total number of ICT systems currently operated by the Department of Public Works is 513.
2. Last update for each of those systems cannot be provided in total as that information is not stored centrally for all those systems.
3. There are 296 ICT systems in the Department of Public Works that have currently been identified for decommissioning – as such it is believed that those 296 systems have no current authorised operators.

**At the Estimates hearing on 12 July the Minister was requested to provide:**

- a) the names and purposes of the systems identified for decommissioning
  - b) the reason for their decommissioning
  - c) the cost to continue these systems
  - d) the cost of decommissioning these systems (Pages 94 and 95 of Hansard).
- On 15 March 2011 the Department's Information Steering committee approved a project to decommission obsolete applications that had previously been identified for decommissioning.
  - At that time the Project Brief estimated that the cost of these systems remaining active was \$124,000 per annum. The estimated cost for the decommissioning project was \$315,000. The project is due to complete the decommissioning work in December 2012.
  - Attached is a list of the 296 applications that are presently identified for decommissioning (**Attachment A**).
  - The reason these applications are being decommissioned is that they have been superseded or are obsolete.

### Conditions for Broadcasters of Proceedings

1. As set out on page 2 in the document titled 'Media Access to Parliamentary Precinct and the Legislative Assembly' tabled in the House of Tuesday, 28 February 2006 (Appendix A) at point 4 in relation to Parliamentary committee meetings or hearing the press will follow the direction of the committee or its chair.
2. In accordance with Standing Order 210 a committee may authorise the broadcasting of its public hearings, so long as the committee complies with any rules that the House may approve for the broadcast of committee proceedings.
3. There is general presumption that Estimates Hearing will be publically broadcast and that the gallery TV news cameras will be able to record estimates hearings, in accordance with the guidelines below, so long as filming does not disturb proceedings. There is a presumption that film footage will be "pooled" as occurs in the Legislative Assembly.

### Guidelines for Camera Operators in Estimates Hearings

1. Cameras will be set up in an area on the floor of the House determined by the Chair.
2. Cameras will only begin to film when the Chair declares the hearing open.
3. Cameras should only focus on the Chair when speaking, the Member who has the call from the Chair and the witness responding to a question from a Member.
4. Shots should be no closer than head and shoulders.
5. Cameras should never focus on a member who does not have the call from the Chair.
6. Reaction shots of a member are not permitted.
7. In the event of unparliamentary behaviour or disturbance on the floor of the House or in the Gallery, the camera is to focus on the Chair or a slightly wider angle shot of the Chamber with incorporates the Chair and the Members of the Committee but which does not show the offending incident.
8. Instructions from the Chair in relation to the operation of the vision equipment shall be observed.


