QUEENSLAND GOVERNMENT RESPONSE

INTRODUCTION

On 23 June 2022, the Industrial Relations and Other Legislation Amendment Bill 2022 (the Bill) was introduced into Parliament.

Following its introduction, the Bill was referred to the Education, Employment and Training Committee (the Committee), with a report back date of 12 August 2022.

On 12 August 2022, the Committee tabled its report (No. 22) in relation to the Bill.

The Queensland Government response to the recommendations made by the Committee is provided below.

RESPONSE TO RECOMMENDATION

Recommendation 1

The Committee recommends the Bill be passed.

Government response

The Government thanks the Committee for its detailed consideration of the Bill and notes the Committee's recommendation that the Bill be passed.

Recommendation 2

The committee recommends that the Minister for Education, Minister for Industrial Relations and Minister for Racing investigate options for addressing the issue of agents who charge a fee to provide representation in the Queensland Industrial Relations Commission (and the Industrial Court).
