Minister's Preface

Queensland's Right to Information (RTI) and Information Privacy (IP) legislation is designed to make more information available to members of the community and provide a framework for the lawful management and handling of individuals' personal information.

Efficient and effective operation of this legislation is critical to ensuring the government's commitment to openness and transparency is met.

While 2020-21 proved something of an anomaly with an unexpected record spike in applications and pages provided through the height of the COVID-19 pandemic, 2021-22 was a year of adjustment.

The demand for RTI and IP applications dipped for the first time in seven years, although the provision of pages considered for release tracked similarly to what they did two years ago.

There was a total of 16,979 RTI and IP access and amendment applications received during the financial year, 1,553 fewer applications lodged across Queensland Government agencies than the previous financial year.

A total of 3,541,730 pages were considered for release – a 23.2 percent reduction on pages considered for release in 2020-21 but 220,000 more pages than in 2019-20.

Excluding the record surge of last year, the number of pages released by agencies increased in line with the annual growth seen in numbers over the previous decade.

Agencies across the government continued to build on endeavours to make accessing government-held information as seamless and cost-effective as possible. As was the case the previous year, there were at least 27 separate activities undertaken by different agencies to further the object of the *Right to Information Act 2009* (RTI Act) and *Information Privacy Act 2009* (IP Act) in 2021-22.

This all reflects positively on the government's commitment to open and transparent operations.

It is pleasing to note that Ministers and agencies advised again that no disciplinary action was taken against any officer in relation to the administration of the RTI Act or the IP Act, nor were any proceedings brought for offences.

RTI and IP officers and agency staff should again be complimented for taking the time to decide information requests in a professional manner.

I am pleased to table this report.

Explanation of terms used in this report

Term	Explanation
Access application	An application for information made under either the RTI Act or Chapter 3 of the IP Act.
Access charge	Charges prescribed under a regulation and payable for being given access to documents. In the reporting period, for example, black and white photocopying charges were 25 cents for each A4 page.
Amendment application	An application made under the IP Act to have personal information amended on the basis that it is inaccurate, incomplete, out of date or misleading.
Application fee	The fee prescribed in the RTI Regulation and payable for an access application under the RTI Act. In line with the <i>Justice Legislation (Fees, Allowances and Other Amounts) Amendment Regulation 2021</i> the RTI Act's application fee increased on 1 July 2021 to \$52.60 – applicable for the reporting period 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022.
Internal review	A review of a decision within an agency by a person who is no less senior than the original decision maker.
External review	A review by the Information Commissioner of a decision made by an agency or Minister.
Processing charge	Charges prescribed in the RTI Regulation for searching for, or retrieving a document, and making, or doing things related to making, a decision on an application. In general, processing charges are payable for RTI Act applications where an agency or Minister spends more than five hours processing non-personal documents. In line with the <i>Justice Legislation (Fees, Allowances and Other Amounts) Amendment Regulation 2021</i> the RTI Act's processing charge increased on 1 July 2021 to \$8.15 for each 15 minutes or part thereof – applicable for the reporting period 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022.
Portfolio/agencies	Portfolio/agencies within a Minister's administrative responsibility are reported on under the relevant department's heading. For example, the Justice and Attorney-General portfolio includes DJAG and the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice, Minister for Women and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic and Family Violence, as well as agencies such as the Legal Services Commission and the Electoral Commission of Queensland, all of which are reported under the DJAG heading.

Overview

This annual report covers the 2021-22 financial year regarding the operation of the *Right to Information Act 2009* (RTI Act) and the *Information Privacy Act 2009* (IP Act).

The primary object of the RTI Act is to give a right of access to information in the government's possession or under the government's control unless, on balance, it is contrary to the public interest to give the access.

The IP Act works in parallel with the RTI Act and provides for the fair collection and handling of personal information by Queensland Government agencies and a right of access to, and amendment of, personal information in the government's possession or under the government's control unless, on balance, it is contrary to the public interest.

The IP Act sets out 11 Information Privacy Principles (IPPs) with which all agencies must adhere, except for Queensland Health and the Hospital and Health Services, which are subject to the National Privacy Principles (NPPs). The IPPs and NPPs govern how Queensland Government agencies collect, store, use and disclose personal information.

Releasing government information

The process of routinely releasing government information to the public is commonly referred to as the "push" model. Under this model, information is released administratively via mechanisms which include agencies' publication schemes and disclosure logs. As a result, access applications for information under the legislation are provided as a mechanism of last resort.

Publication Scheme

A publication scheme is a structured list of an agency's information that is readily available to the public, free of charge wherever possible. Every government agency which is subject to the RTI Act must have a publication scheme.

Disclosure Log

Disclosure logs form part of the "push" model where information released under an RTI application is made available for access to the public by being published on agency websites. They provide access to information already released under the RTI application process. They can provide a cost and time benefit to both the individual and agency by reducing the number of additional applications under the RTI Act for the same information.

Furthering the objects of the Acts

In the reporting period, State Government agencies made efforts to further the objects of the RTI Act and the IP Act. This information is summarised in Appendix 21.

Reporting requirements

Legislative basis

Section 185 of the RTI Act and section 194 of the IP Act require statistical and other information to be collected from Ministers and agencies. Each requirement is outlined as follows:

- section 185(1) of the RTI Act and section 194(1) of the IP Act require the Attorney-General and Minister for Justice, Minister for Women and Minister for the Prevention of Domestic and Family Violence to prepare a report and table it in Parliament;
- section 185(2) of the RTI Act and section 194(2) of the IP Act refer to the *Right to Information Regulation 2009* (RTI Regulation) and the *Information Privacy Regulation 2009* (IP Regulation) which set out the details of the information required to be included in the report (refer to Appendix 22); and
- section 194(3) of the IP Act provides that an annual report under this section may be included as part of an annual report the Minister is required to give under the RTI Act.

Summary of data

This report includes statistics for both the RTI Act and IP Act for the period 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022.

Data from all Ministers and agencies covered by the RTI Act and the IP Act were collected and collated by Right to Information and Privacy, Department of Justice and Attorney-General (DJAG) for inclusion in this report.

The detailed data for Ministers and agencies is set out in Appendices 1 - 20 of this report and includes information required under:

- section 8(a) - (g) and (j) of the RTI Regulation; and
- section 6(a) - (g) and (j) of the IP Regulation.

For the 2021-22 financial year, all figures are reported based on the actual applications processed by individual RTI and information privacy business units, unless otherwise indicated in the tables.

Disciplinary action

For the 2021-22 financial year, Ministers and agencies advised no disciplinary action was taken against any officer in relation to the administration of the Acts under section 8(h) of the RTI Regulation or section 6(h) of the IP Regulation.

Proceedings brought for offences

For the 2021-22 financial year, Ministers and agencies advised no proceedings were brought for offences under section 175(1) or (3) of the RTI Act or section 184(1) or (3) of the IP Act (section 8(i) of the RTI Regulation and section 6(i) of the IP Regulation).

Relevant facts indicating efforts by agencies or Ministers to further the objects of the RTI Act and IP Act (section 8(k) of the RTI Regulation and section 6(k) of the IP Regulation)

Appendix 21 summarises the efforts made by Ministers and agencies during the 2021-22 financial year which build on efforts made in previous years.

Machinery of Government (moG) changes

Two Administrative Arrangements Orders and two Administrative Arrangements Amendment Orders made by the Governor in Council applied to this reporting period, namely:

- Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 1) 2021 (*made by the Governor in Council on 29 June 2021*);
- Administrative Arrangements Amendment Order (No. 2) 2021 (*made by the Governor in Council on 9 September 2021*);
- Administrative Arrangements Order (No. 2) 2021 (*made by the Governor in Council on 7 October 2021*); and
- Administrative Arrangements Amendment Order (No. 3) 2021 (*made by the Governor in Council on 9 December 2021*).

Noncompliant access applications

If an application fails to comply with the requirements under the legislation, even after consultation with the applicant, a Prescribed Written Notice of the decision is sent under section 33 of the RTI Act or section 53 of the IP Act – *Noncompliance with application requirement*. This allows the applicant rights of review.

Noncompliant applications are not included in this report, except when the application was subject to an internal or external review, as it is not a requirement of either the RTI Regulation or the IP Regulation.

Overview and comparison

Detailed information for each agency is presented in Appendices 1 - 20 and summarised in the tables and figures below. The information reported is based on the actual applications processed by individual RTI and IP business units within State Government agencies.

Table 1 presents summary information about 2021-22 activity by agency.

It shows:

- the total number of RTI and IP access and amendment applications received as 16,979, a decrease from 18,532 applications in 2020-21;
- the total number of pages considered was 3,541,730 representing a 23.2 percent decrease from 4,611,897 in 2020-21;
- internal reviews of 283 compared with 255 for 2020-21;
- external reviews of 561 compared with 583 for 2020-21; and
- total fees and charges received of \$624,710 in 2021-22 compared with \$645,937 in 2020-21.

¹ Statistics in relation to applications for external review of decisions by Ministers and agencies may differ from those reported in the 'Office of the Information Commissioner (Queensland) Annual Report 2021/2022' depending on how agencies have captured information regarding correspondence from the Office of the Information Commissioner (OIC). For example, when OIC seeks information from agencies relating to an external review request that it has received and then decided not to accept.

Figure 1 shows the total number of RTI and IP access and amendment applications received over the last ten years by State Government agencies. These applications have decreased between 2020-21 (18,532) and 2021-22 (16,979). These figures include both applications for information (access applications) and applications to have personal information amended on the basis it is inaccurate, incomplete, out of date or misleading (amendment applications).

Figure 1. Number of RTI and IP access and amendment applications received, 2012-13 to 2021-22

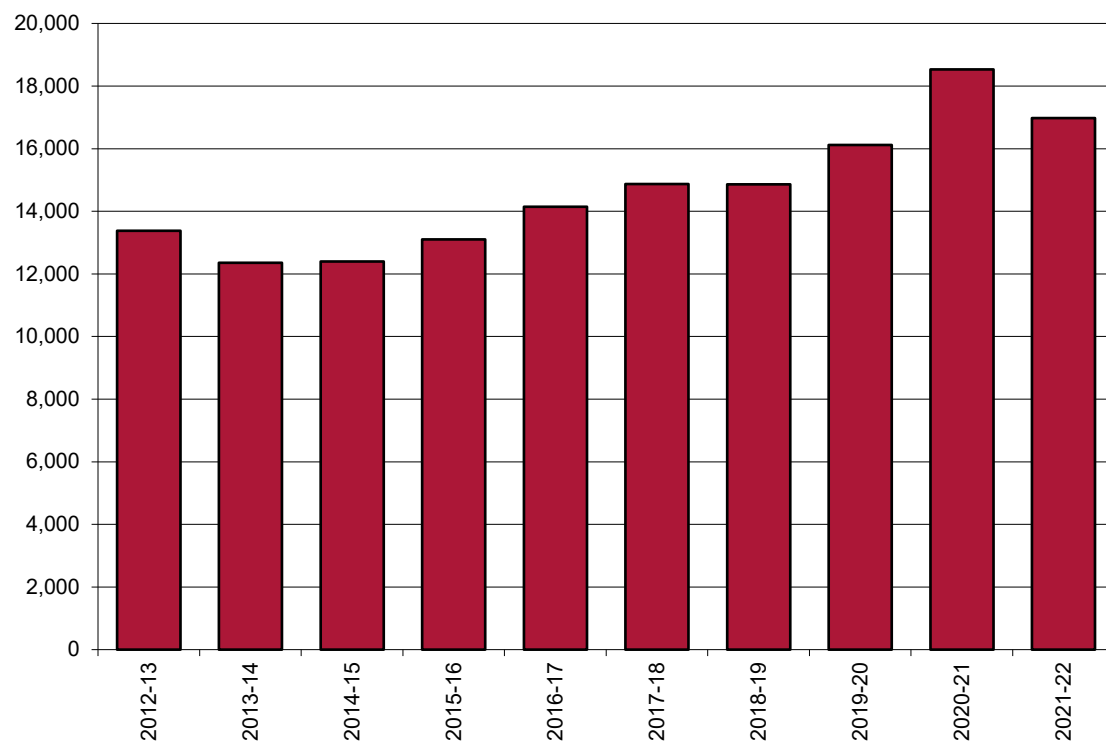
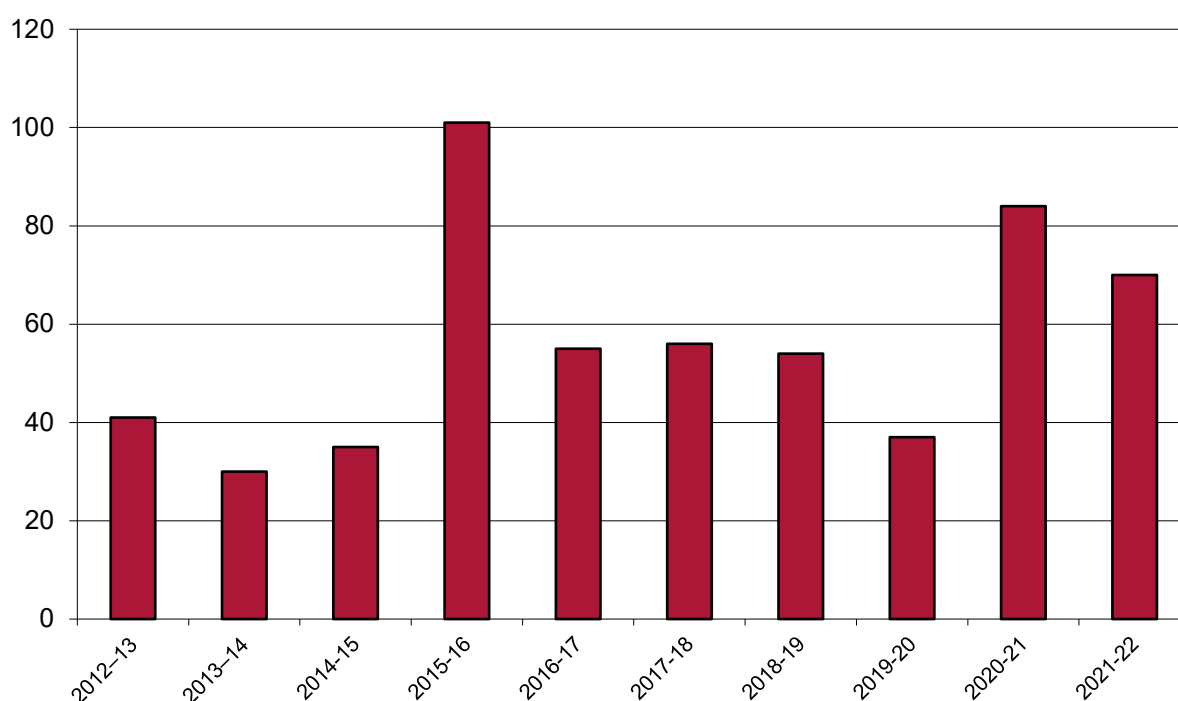

- (i) any proceedings brought for an offence against section 184(1) or (3) of the Act;*
- (j) for each agency or Minister – the amount of charges received under the Act;*
- (k) any other relevant fact indicating an effort by an agency or Minister to further the object of the Act.*

Notes about Appendices 1 to 20

Deletion where no data returned

Where an agency has submitted a 'nil return' the line has been deleted from the table.

Disclosure logs section 8(d) RTI Regulation

A disclosure log makes information disclosed to an applicant under the RTI Act available to a wider public audience. The RTI Act requires documents accessed by applicants, that do not contain the applicant's personal information and subject to certain other limitations (refer to section 78B(2) of the RTI Act), to be published to an agency's disclosure log as soon as possible after the applicant accesses the documents.

Section 78B(2) states –

Without limiting subsection (1), an agency must delete from any document or information included in a disclosure log under section 78 or 78A, any information (including an individual's name) –

- (a) the publication of which is prevented by law; or*
- (b) that may be defamatory; or*
- (c) that, if included in the disclosure log, would unreasonably invade an individual's privacy; or*
- (d) that is, or allows to be ascertained, information –*
 - (i) of a confidential nature that was communicated in confidence by a person other than the agency; or*
 - (ii) that is protected from disclosure under a contract; or*
- (e) that, if included [in] the disclosure log, would cause substantial harm to an entity.*

Total pages published to an agency's disclosure log for the period 1 July 2021 to 30 June 2022 is detailed in Table 4 for each individual agency.

Recording refusal of access – section 8(c) RTI Regulation and section 6(c) IP Regulation

Section 47(3)(a) of the RTI Act provides that access to a document may be refused to the extent the document comprises exempt information under section 48. Section 48(4) of the RTI Act (exempt information) defines exempt information as information that is exempt information under Schedule 3. Refusals of access to exempt information are recorded in the Annual Report as the specific Schedule 3 exemption, for example 'sch3(7)' which is the exemption where *information is exempt information if it would be privileged from production in a legal proceeding on the ground of legal professional privilege.*

Section 47(3)(b) provides that access to a document may be refused to the extent the document comprises information the disclosure of which will be contrary to the public interest under section 49. Schedule 4 then sets out the factors for deciding the public interest.

Refusals of access to 'contrary to the public interest' information may therefore be recorded in the Annual Report as either 's.49-sch4' or the specific Schedule 4 factor for non-disclosure, for example 'sch4(3)(3)' which is the factor for non-disclosure where *disclosure of the information could reasonably be expected to prejudice the protection of an individual's right to privacy*.
